Letters read: Letter from M. S. Brainard to chief Brown concerning troubles at Eagles dances.

Letter from Harold Dodds offering sanitary service.

Letter from E. J. Reede of Oakland, Oregon inquiring about job in the water department. Referred to Elmer Bankus.

LeRoy Weideman was present and accepted a request to work on the Planning and Zoning committee. He also gave a report on building permits and presented K sample application forms. He read a request that the council consider adopting the presented code and ordinance and he pointed out the value of this information for future use.

onsiderable discussion was given to this subject and several improvements suggested on the proposed permit.

Attorney Hall read from the "tate plumbing code to show the council what they would be adopting if they adopted the state code by reference. Mr. Hall also read the state electrical code.

Councilman with made a motion that we ask attorney Hall to draw up an ordinance on building permits and code as outlined by the Planning & Zoning committee, seconded by councilman Lesmeister,—ayes Lesmeister, Smith and Fox. Absent Young. Passed.

Earl arson was present and asked the council how hong he had to construct a burner at his planzing mill. He was informed that as yet the city of Brookings had no ordinance covering such things.

Councilman Smith suggested that the city might be able to construct a city jail in the very near future by getting bids on it and asking the contractor to accept warrants in payment after July 1, 1952 the cost to be included in next years budget.

Councilman Lesmeister made a motion that the council pass the resolution as read, seconded by councilman Smith. Ayes: Fox, Lesmeister, Smith. Absent Young.

Attorney Hall read from McQuillins Municipal Corporations volumes on the city rights to borrow money or assume financial obligations.

A deed was read deeding to the City of Brookings by Merie and John Teets a strip of Land to be used as a roadway commonly known as Del Norte Land.

Councilman Smith moved that we accept the deed, seconded by councilman Fox. Ayes: Smith, Lesmeister, Fox. Absent Young.

Attorney Hall read ordinance#14 the second time by title.

Councilman mith made a motion that the name of the circle drive or street now known as Pacific Circle be changed to Crissey Circle at such time as the council can properly do so, seconded by councilman Fox. Ayes: Fox, Smith Lesmeister. Absent Young.

Councilman Lesmeister moved that these bills be paid when we have the money, seconded by councilman mith. Ayes: Fox, Smith, Lesmeister. Absent Young.

Mayor Dimmick brought up the subject of gasoline and oil truck delivery in Brookings and thought they should pay city license. They The secretary was instructed to send them statements for license fees.

Parking meters were discussed at some length but any action was deferred.

Motion by councilman Fox, seconded by councilman Lesmeister that the meeting adjourn. Motion passed. Council adjourned at 12:25 A. M.
