Correspondence:

A letter from the Christian Science Church the condition of the street in front of the church, was referred to Mr. Arp, who promised to rectify the matter..

A letter from Mayor Dimmick, calling attention to the fact that his term of office as mayor ends at the next regular meeting and thanking all, who helped him during his term of office. He pointed out that a new mayor would have to be elected in January.

A letter from the State Highway Department concerning the re-location of the highway on property North of town. It proposed to deed property to city, provided the city puts in roadway of 30' width on both sides of highway together with drains and culverts but to commence no work until the state's specifications are received by the City.

The Mayor reported contacting Mr. George Baldwin at the League of Oregon Cities meeting in regard to the budget and was told that transfers of funds is allowable if we do not exceed total of budget.

Harvey Foster was present to urge that he be allowed to install an oil distributing station for the Richfield Oil Company in a restricted area zoned C-I. It was brought out that there was objection by adjacent property owners to the erection of such a plant. It was the concensus of opinion of those present that the property owners in the area should be

ven the opportunity of stating their objections. It was also pointed out that the ty had gone tonconsiderable trouble to get the city properly zoned and that we ould not ignore the ordinanceccreating the zones and regulations, nor sanction

Euilding inspector, Mr. Arp said Ordinance #35 which amends portions of the ning ordinance, gives the procedure to be taken, when such a change in zoning is sired. Atty. Hall also explained legal procedure and said it was possible for a council to act before the plaining ordinance is passed, when petition has been per signed and presented to them, and hearing held. Mr. Arp also pointed out at there is a 20% protest from property owners, the vote of council, would be unanimous. Mr. Foster was advised to circulate his petition and present at next council meeting.

cense Renewal:

Motion was made by Mr. Fox, seconded by Mr. Smith thatDon's Cliff House's plication for renewal of it's liquor license, have the approval of the council. rried.

The Mayor brought up the matter of street signing. He pointed out that the City \$ \$600 in it's buget for this purpose and felt that we should ascertain the cost such signing so that we could keep within that amount. Iron pipe with white and ack lettering on metal was suggested. The mayor appointed Mr. Arp, Mr. Echols and Young as a committee to take care of this matter.

The Mayor reported several meetings with Mr. Bankus in regard to the purchase fire hydrants and reported his price to be \$250 ea. and \$4.00 each rental. He so reported contacting the P.U.C. and being told that if Mr. Bankus would not me to reasonable terms, they would come to Brookings and personally settle the tter. The P.U.C. asked that we have our City Attorney write them a review of e matter.

The Coos-Gurry Electric, through director H.G. Nelson, proposed a change in ranchise with us to the effect that the electric company would add three recreet lights making a total of 25 and give the City free lighting in lieu the proposed 2 % tax. This offer to be extended to Port Orford and Gold Beach so. Mr. Nelson said that any lights over 25 would be charged the regular rate \$50.00 annually. Mr. Hall said he assumed, inasmuchas these other two towns re involved that the electric company was drawing up the ordinance and that they uld be reminded to include repealing clause in Brookings copy. This proposal the entire approval of those present.

The Mayor brought up a dangerous situation in the matter of a bobbed wire nce on a Mrs. Wm. Stout's property on Pine Street. He said it extended several et into the street and was dangerous. Believes we should outlaw this type of nce. He promised to have Mr. Echols check the width and contact Mrs. Stout and k that she remove same.

Mr. Smith entertained a motion at this time that we thank our outgoing uncilmen, Fred Fox, for his unfailing good nature and excellent cooperation all matters of council and that he be made an ex office member. His motion was conded by all present.

dinance #33 was read by title for the third time and on mtion by Mr. Young, conded by Mr. Fox, passed this 9th day of December by the following vote: Fox, aye, smeister, aye; Smith, aye; and Young, aye. Recorder requested to send copy to . McBride. Certified.

Whereupon Councilmen Young read <u>Ordinance #40 once in full</u>, twice by title and on motion by Mr. Lesmeister, seconded by Mr. Young, <u>passed at this meeting of the council</u> by the following vote: Fox, aye; Lesmeister, aye; Smith, aye; and Young, aye.

The Mayor brought up the need for the city to prepare for a street department this next year. He pointed out that Mr. Arp, who has taken over much of this work, was the logical man to head this department. A discussion was held or ays and means of creatng this department at once. Taking his salary out of the state street was considered feasible and applicable under the circumstances. Motion was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Mr. Fox that the following

resoltion creating a street department and department head, be passed:

RES OLUTION

WHEREAS, the demands which are being made upon the Mayor and Councilmen by the citizens of the City of Brookings, for attention to the street problems of the city, are such that the full time of one person would be consumed by such demands,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that there should be and is hereby created the office of Street Superintendent, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the mayor be authorized and he hereby is authorized to appoint such person as he deems proper to such office, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Street Superintendent should be compensated for his services as such in the sum of \$170.00 per month.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Street Superintendent shall be responsible to the council for maintaining all city streets and alleys in such condition as the coldistant shall direct.

Be it further resolved that all complaints, requests, and demands relative to streets and alleys, shall be referred to and processed by the street superintendent.
