REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MAY 6, 1952

Meeting was called to order at 8:20 P: M. by Mayor Dimmick.
Councilmen present: Young, Smith, Fox, Lesmeister and Chief Brown.

Minutes of regular meeting of April 22, 1952 read. Approved as read.

MOTION by councilman Lesmeister, seconded by councilman Fox that bills be paid. Motion was unanimously passed.

Motion by/Lesmeister, seconded by councilman Smith that an account be opened at the
Oregon State Bank for the city of Brookings. Motion put by mayor Dimmick and declared
unanimously passed.

Recorder was instructed to write letter to State Highway Department telling them that the council would furnish full information later relative to parallel parking.

Mr. Jacobs was recognized and spoke briefly regarding his property on highway 101 and asked if building shown in picture which he exhibited would pass the zoning requirements of zone C-1. The council assured him that if the building was as pictured that it would be acceptable.

Tommy Thompson of Hearthstone restaurant was present and spoke briefly regardin coin operated machines. He said that minors needed some machine which they would be allowed to play and wanted to know if there was such a machine. The councilmen suggested that Mayor Dimmick, Chief Brown and Attorney Hall look into the matter and see what can be done.

Day Light Saving time was discussed and Mr. Roy Dimmick was present and spoke in favor of it. Two petitions signed by the citizens of the community wax and petitioning the council to declare Brookings on DST was presented. The council declared themselves in favor of DST and asked all citizens to put their clocks ahead one hour at 2:00 A. M on May 11.

Don Gosknell, representative of Howard-Cooper Corporation was present and gave figures on cost of new fire equipment and Chassis. Total cost was \$12,076.00 plus cost of 250 feet of hose. After some discussion the council instructed Mayor Dimmick to sign an order for the truck which is on lease-contract basis covering a four year period. Mr. Gosnell said that the truck could be delivered in about ninety days. The council expressed a desire to have it by July 4th but Mr. Gosnell was dubious about being able to deliver it in that short a time.

Councilman Fox said that one of his drivers had looked at the grader offered to the city for \$1000.00. He thought it was too small. Some of the councilmen thought it still might be a good buy for grading streets that were all ready built. Councilman Fox will invistigate further.

Councilman Smith reported talking to Mr. Bankus and that Mr. Bankus informed him that water clorination was in effect on Ransom creek and would be in effect on Ferry creek in about two weeks.

Councilman Lesmeister reported that he had called Klamath Falls relative to plumbing equipment in the old jail over there but they informed him that it would not pass sanitary inspection.

Ordinance on parking of trailers in town read but was deferred for future action after some discussion.

MOTION by councilman Fox, seconded by councilman Young, that the meeting adjourn.

Mayor Dimmick declared the meeting adjourned at 11:30 P. M.
