REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING July 1, 1952

Meeting was called to order at 8:30 P. M. by Mayor Dimmick.

Councilmen present: Fox, Lesmeister, Young. Smith Absent

Others present: Attorney Hall, hief Brown, Judge Nelson, Engineer Echols, Bldg.

Minutes of regular meeting of June 17 was read. Minutes approved as read.

MOTION by Councilman Lesmeister, seconded by councilman Young that bills be paid and that of L. Z. Harbin for grading streets be charged against street fund. Motion passed unanimously.

The council discussed methods of disposing of car impounded at Azalea garage by police department. Some thought that there should be an ordinance giving city right to dispose of such vehicles. Attorney Hall advised strong ordinance after law research.

Chief Brown reported that he had been in pessession of a 22 calibre pistol for ninety days and asked the council's disposition of it.

MOTION by councilman Fox, seconded by councilman Lesmeister that pistol be placed in city arsenal. Motion passed unanimously.

After considerable discussion by the council of the lighting district and the city assuming its operation after the first of July, the recorder was instructed to write a letter to the Electric Power Co. asking them to send a representative to Brookings to work out a contract relative to city lights.

Recorder was also instructed to write letter to James Yelton asking him to call a meeting of the present lighting district board and to clear up all bills previous to July 1, 1952, as the city would not assume any bills of the district previous to that date.

Mr. Kruger spoke briefly and informed the council of his desire to obtain a beer license for the Smoke Shop when Mr. Cotton vacated the place. In this discussion it was brought out that James & Edith Robinson had applied to the State Liquor Control Board for a Restaurant lass "B" license.

Attorney Hall read contract which he had written, a contract between the City of Brookings and LeRoy Weideman for construction of a city jail. Mr. Weideman, who was present, objected to the part of the contract relative to installation of fixtures and said that it was not included in original bid. The contract was revised and initialed to agree with original bid.

Councilman Young presented the following resolution and moved its adoption, seconded by councilman Lesmeister.

RESOLUTION:

BE it resolved, that Mayor Robert O. Dimmick and Recorder R. V. Guerrettaz be and they are authorized to execute the contract with LeRoy Weideman for construction of the city jail which contract was presented to the council.

BE it further resolved, that Mayor Robert O. Dimmick and Recorder R. V. Guerrettaz be and they are authorized to make the pregress payments called for in the contract.

The motion was put to the council by Mayor Dimmick and he declared it passed unanimously.

ORDINANCE # 23 was read in full by attorney Hall for first time.

** An oedinance regulating the collection and disposal of garbage within the City of Brookings, Oregon and granting an exclusive Franchise therefor, fefining the terms thereof, and providing rates.**

Mayor Dimmick gave a report of parking meters and briefly stated what Mr. Bowles of the Park-O-Meter Co. had said. Contract form left by Mr. Bowles was taken by Mr. Hall for his approval.

ORDINANCE # 12A was read by Attorney Hall in full the first time.

"An ordinance regulating and licensing coin operated music boxes, the operators and distributors thereof, providing license fees therefor, providing penlaties for the violation thereof, repealing ordinance No. 12 and declaring an emergency."

ORDINANCE NO. 24 was read by attorney Hall for first time in full.

"An ordinance regulating and Taxing certain devices, the operators and distributors thereof, defining certain terms, providing penalties for violation thereof and declaring an emergency."

ORDINANCE NO. 25 was read by Attorney Hall in full the first time.

"An ordinance progibiting gambling equipment, apparatus and paraphernalia, making a possession or ownership thereof unlawful, providing for the seizure and destruction thereof providing for the preservation thereof as evidence, and declaring an emergency."

Motion by councilman Fox that the meeting adjourn. Mayor Dimmick declared the meeting adjourned at 12:35 A. M.
