The legality of shutting off water service for non-payment of sewer bills was discussed. The recorder was asked to write Mr. Heltzel of the Public Utilities Commission for an opinion in regard to this matter.

ORDINANCE # 65:

Motion was made by Mr. Manley, seconded by Mr. Smith that Ordinance #65 be read once in full, twice by title and passed at this meeting of the Council.

Whereupon Ordinance #65, entitled " AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE MAINTENANCE OF SEWER SUPPLY LINES AND SEWER PIPES AS THE SAME ARE NOW OR HEREAFTER MAY BE CONSTRUCTED OR MAINTAINED BELOW THE SURFACE OF ANY STREET: PROVIDING PENALTIES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY " was read in full once, twice by title and on motion by Mr. Campbell seconded by Mr. Smith passed by the following vote: Mr. Campbell, aye; Mr. Manley, aye; Mr. Smith, aye; and Mr. Dimmick, aye.

It was ordered that Ord. #65 be published in full in the local paper together with a statement defining the Council's position in relation to the sewer matter to be prepared by Mr. Smith and Joe Murphy.

The application of Mr. Joy and Mr. Matineau for a sewer connection permit was discussed and taken under consideration.
