Road. Mr. MCarton presented a billdin the sum of \$47.50 for damages sustained in traveling this road.

Mrs. Raveks voiced the opinion of the group that half of this road be kept in passable condition during construction.

Motion was made by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Manley that Mr. Echols see to that this road be put in a safe condition and authorized him to ask the School Board to see that said street is immediately put in passable condition and that Mr. Brown do the work. Carried.

A letter from the Brookings Studio requesting that no license be issued to fly by night firms as they are here to-day and gone to-morrow. Recorder asked to write Mr. Strong advising him that the Green River law was designed to protect and safeguard merchants.

Letter from the League of Oregon Cities in reply to our request for septic tank cleaning franchise, read. Only franchises dealing with sewer cleaning was inclosed.

Mr. Ackley reported as follows on the ownership of the City Hall:

that the Chamber of Commerce quit claim the property back to Mr. and Mrs. Williamson and that the Williamsons give a deed directly to the City. Mr. Ackley authorized to see that this is done.

The Council's report on the Lessard petition to re-zone was read. Motion was made by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Lesmeister that whe council concurr with the recommendation made by the Planning Commission. The motion was passed by the following vote: Mr. Young, aye, Mr. I meister, aye, Mr. Manley, no and Mr. Smith, no.

Motion was made by Mr. Manley, seonded by Mr. Lesmeister that the recorder be authorized to call in for payment the following interest bearing State St. Ed. warrants: #620, 621 and 622.

The proposed harter Ordinance was presented by Mr. Ackley and read in full. Mr. Dempsey, chairman of this committee suggested a copy of this ordinance be sent the League of Oregon Cities. Motion was made by Mr. Young, seconded by Mr. Smith that such authority be given the Charter Committee.

The final report on the Boy Scout's petition by the Blanning Commission was presented. Council hearing on this petition was set for March 24, Wednes. and notice to be given in the March 18th. issue of the Brookings-Harbor Pilot.

The Planning Commission 's report on the Gibbs temporary use permit recommending it be allowed for a nine month's period, was read. Motion w made by Mr. Smith, seconded by Mr. Manley that this report and 1 ... ommendation be approved and Mr. Gibbs so advised, that date of termination would be December 10, 1954.

AREPORT

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council of Brookings, Oregon

Gentlemen: We, the City Planning Commission of Brookings, do herewith present a report on the request of the Gibbs Concrete Products for a temporary permit to install a portable rock crusher on Arnold Tax LOt 30-F, Section 6, T. 41 S. R. 13 in connection with a cement mixing plant now existing on said propetty. This property is in an R-2 zone.

On March 4, 1954 after due notice and pursuant to Ordinance #19, section 6 on temporary uses, the Commission did hold a public hearing on the above request to give all persons interested and the general public, an opportunity to be heard.

Mr. Doyle Harroun, representing his mother and being intested in adjoining property to that of the Bibbs Concrete Products, protested against the permit for temporary use of a rock crusher.

The Phanhing Commission gave consideration to the serious circumstances of the Gibbs Concrete Products Co., resulting from Chet to River floods at it's present crusher site. They further considered the protest at the hearing and the very close proximity to the school grounds and proposed school development.

Therefore the Commission does hereby recommend the granting of a temporary use permit to terminate at the end of a nine months' period.
