Correspondence:

A letter from the Secretary of State acknowledging our new population status of 2273 and advising that future apportionment of highway and liquor revenues would be made on the new census figure, read.

The official certificate of the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Census was read and presented.

A letter from a Brookings' Booster in regard to the Beaver State Motel, was read.

The Recorder was instructed to get the necessary application from filled out for Oak Street and sent in to John W. Cottrell of the State Highway Department so that Brookings will be eligible for a part of the \$250,000 special allotment fund.

Mayor Dimmick reported that the school sewer will be hooked into the sewer

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behind the Chetco Inn. Mr. Thompson advised that this proposed ehook-up is cheaper and better.

Mr. Ackley to find out when the State Highway proposes to get the work done on the street in front of the City Hall.

The City Recorder was authorized to call for bids on oil and gas for use in the city's equipment and also to call for bids on heating gas for the jail and city hall. Bids to be opened August 9th. 1954.

The City Recorder was authorized to issue state street fund warrants in the \$4000f \$2500 to the Rupley Chevrolet Company of Castle Rock in payment of the balance due on the street gradeRand sweeper.

Mr. Echols was asked to bring profiles of work done for the City, so that permanent records will be on file in the recorder's office.

Postmaster Thompson asked that a meter be removed in front of the Post Office and space painted yellow so that space can be reserved for the mail truck. It was so agreed and Police Chief Cross authorized to have this done.

Mr. Thompson also advised the Council of a proposed plan to better mail service to the North a day sooner by Baster connections. He said Southern mail service would not be affected. He asked that everyone write the District Supt. of Postal Transportation Service at Portland, urging this change.

Mr. Ackley was on motion by Mr. Mandey seconded by Mr. Smith, authorized to go to Salem and follow up the sidewalk conveyance matter. carried.

Mr. Arp presented the Planning Commission's numbering plan for houses. Plan attached hereto.

ire Chief Nelson proposed that fire hydrants be painted reddand no parking timeters close to hydrants. Chief Cross said that signs for this purpose was needed. Mr. Cross was authorized to remove meters close to fire hydrants.

Motion was made by Mr. Smith, Seconded by Mr. Campbell that the counnil adopt the street house numbering system as presented by the Planning Commission. Carried.

No report as yet on the Mill Beach Park deal according to Mr. Lesmeister.

Mr. Ackley reported sending out letters to delinquest property owners on the Hillside and Pacific Avenue improvement. Recorder reported no results as yet. Motion was made by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Manley that a progress payment of \$1000 be paid the contractor on this job, LeRoy Weideman. Carried.

The matter of the City taking over the storage of the ambulance was discussed. City Attorney Ackley said it was unlawful for the city to do so and the matter was tabled.

he City Recorder was instructed to write Morgan & Bertelson that we do not desire an audit at this time and that a copy of last year's audit be sent Percy Brown & Company with the request for an estimate on an audit.

Bd. of Directors

Mr. Manley reported that the Chamber of Commerce/was unwilling to deed the City Hall property to the City. It was thought advisable for the City Council to meet with the Board of Directors in regard to the matter.

Mrs. Moulton spoke in protest of the Green River Ordinance. She maintained it was unfair and discriminatory and that the City of Brookings had out-grawn this type of competition control. Mrs. Modulton represented the Minnesota Woolen Company of Minneapolis. Mrs. Moulton was granted permission to continue to call at home upon request of the occupants until such time as

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the council approves an ordinance that meets the requirements of the problem.

The Roberts Bros. carnival was granted permission to operate in Brookings during the Lily Festival.

Motion was made by Mr. Manley that we adjourn until August 10, 1954.
