## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL April 12, 1955

Meeting called to order by Mayor Brimm.

Present: Councilmen Breuer, Campbell, Manley and Yeaton.

Officers Present: Atty. Ackley, Chief Cross, Fire Chief Mendenhall, Judge Nelson and Recorder Kanick. Others were Messrs. Hanks, Loring, Nettleton, EshoEs; MeGulley, &Mr. Hill State Eductoring Inspector, Mr.

New Councilman, Mr. Yelton, was officially welcomed into the Council by Mayor Brimm and Councilmen Breuer, Campbell and Manley.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Report of the Planning Commission, as follows, was read by the Recorder:

The Planning Commission of the City of Brookings recommends to the City Council that Section 6 of the Building Code, Ord. #19, be revised to read: that the approval of the Planning Commission is necessary for the erection of 2 or more buildings on adjacent lets or two or more buildings in the same sub-division.

Gladys Kanick, Secy. Planning Commission.

Atty. Ackley gave the opinion that such a change was unnecessary inasmuch as the Planning Commission has all the powers required, he said, to accomplish it's purpose.

Mr. Echols, representing himself and his client, Mr. Kerr, brought up the matter of an R-1 subdivision and was referred to the Planning Commission. He also asked for a chance to bid on the proposed water survey.

Fire Chief Mendenhall reported adversely on the smog situation at the Plywood. His report on fire hazards was read by the recorder. It was suggested that letters be written to each restaurant calling attention to this situation.

Re-rating of the City was discussed and the Mayor was authorized to write the Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau, after Mr. Yelton investigates and finds such a request in order.

Mr. Hill, State Electrical Inspector recommended that the City take over electrical inspections. Mr. Campbell and Mr. Reed to study the matter and report at next Council meeting.

Mr. McCulloch was present to request that he be allowed to put in a feed store on the greenhouse property of H.E.Gowotendorst located in an R-3 zone on the corner of Oak and Pine Sts. The matter was referred to the Planning Commission for study and recommendation.

Motion was made by Mr. Breuer seconded by Mr. Yelton that \$300.00 be included in the 1955-56 budget for weed control. Carried.

Mr. Campbell reported that the Rainier Brewing Company would be moved back of present site in a position that was agreeable to the circulators of the petition objecting to the sign. Mr. Campbell also said that the sign company, Foster Kleiser had agreed to make this change withing 15 days. Mr. Campbell also agreed to check further with the petitioners to be sure this new location was agreeable to all.

The Recorder reported that the agreement send Judge Forsythe in the matter of issuing dog licenses, had not been returned. Mr. Ackley agreed to write

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the Court at Gold Beach for a decision in the matter and for tags to be issued with the licenses.

Fire District: Material relative to granting fire protection to rural fire districts were referred to Mr. Manley for study and recommendation.

Mr. Brauer reported that he had asked Al Mincer to service with him on the ense committee, replacing Ken Osborne.

A fire proof cabinet to protect official records was discussed. The need for such protection was emphasized and it was decided to include this item in the 1955-56 budget.

The Recorder reported that additional payments had been made on Hillside and Pacific to the amount of \$350.20, Clive Owens paying in full and Roy Brown paying \$100.00 on account.

Chief Cross reported himself well pleased with the new police car and that he had purchased a new siren and had it installed.

PETITION FROM MOORE LANE IN RE: WATER SERVICE

A petition from property owners on Moore Lane asking for water service, was read. Motion was made by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Manley that Mr. Bankus be notified that he had to furnish water service to these property owners.

RF ALING SECION 220F ORDINANCE NO.130F THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, AND DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY" be read once in full, twice by title and passed at this meeting of
