

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
June 8, 1955

Meeting called to order by Mayor Brimm.

Present: Councilmen Breuer, Manley and Yelton.

Officers and others: Atty. Ackley, Recorder Kanick, May Smith.

Sewer Purchase:

Motion was made by Mr. Yelton, seconded by Mr. Manley, that the City Atty. Mr. Ackley be instructed to go to Portland and take up the matter of the sewer purchase with Mr. Shuler, to present the problem to him and get his advice for the purpose of floating a bond issue to buy the present existing sewer system at the appraisal price of \$29,044.66 set by Cornell, Howland, Hayes, and Merryfield.

Deeds from State Highway Commission:

Mr. Ackley reported having contacted the Highway Department for these deeds but to date hadn't received them or any reply.

Beresa Bond:

Mr. Ackley reported that he needed the plans and specifications in order to be able to make out a performance bond because a list of these should be included in the bond: viz; the time or completion, the method of paving, sewer line, and water mains, also a clause compelling Beresa, Inc. to carry out each such item listed and if the City is compelled to do so, that the Surety Bond will pay the City. Mr. Reed and Mr. Ackley to meet Monday and get all particulars in this matter clarified and the bond drawn up.

Grayschel Bldg.

Motion was made by Mr. Breuer, seconded by Mr. Manley that a notice to repair a certain sidewalk be served upon Chas. Grayschel and Roy Weideman and work to be completed by the June 28th. meeting of the Council. Carried.

The Mayor reported that the Palmer building plans show extension into the street 42 inches farther than present buildings. Complaints have been made to the building inspector, Mr. Reed, in regard to this. The matter was referred to the Planning Commission and motion was made by Mr. Manley, seconded by Mr. Yelton, that Mayor Brimm request the planning Commission to hold a special meeting for the purpose of advising the Council whether a permit should be issued according to these plans and specifications. Carried.

Policing of B & J. Lounge.

Chief Cross was asked to contact James Robinson about policing his lounge as complaints had come in regarding laxness in the matter at his place.

Motion was made by Mr. Manley that meeting adjourn to re-convene in regular session on June 14th. 1955.
