Mr. Ayers of the HI-Way Commission was present and gave a fine talk on paving of streets and roads. He was here to inspect E sy and Pioneer Streets. He stressed the importance of good drainage on all paving programmes. He stated that if theddrainagegrading, and filling were done by the Special Assessment District, he would recommend to the State Hi-Way Commission that the project be allowed. He felt confident the recommendation would be allowed and the City would receive the \$15,000 from the State.
