

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the City Council

September 13th, 1955

Meeting called to order by Mayor Brimm.

Councilmen Present: Messrs. Yelton, Manley, Breuer.

Officers Present: Attor. Ackley, Supt. Reed and Mae D. Smith.

Others Present: Mrs. Mildred Burns, Messrs. Echols, Murphy, McKenzie A.H. Rice and Chief Cross. Mr. Thompson.

Minutes of Regular Meeting of August 23rd, read and approved.

Minutes of Meeting of Sept. 6th read and approved.

Contract on water survey was introduced.

Mrs. Burns who represented the Brookings Water Co. stated, Mr. Bankus, owner of the Brookings Water Co., was willing to cooperate with the Engineering Co., the City had engaged to make the water survey, and all data would be available to them. Also Mr. Bankus will have his own appraisal.

Discussion followed.

Motion by Mr. Yelton, Seconded Mr. Breuer, The Council proceed with instruction of the engineering firm of Cornell, Hayes, Howland and Merryfield to make a survey of the Brookings Water Co. UNan. Carried.

Letter was read from Mr. Echols about a half years license, for their new business, The Brookings Flower Shop. Motion by Mr. Breuer, the Council grant one half years license to the Brookings Flower Co.. Fee to be \$7.50. Seconded Mr Manley. Carried.

No license report.

Council thought the Chamber of Commerce should be represented at the Telephone meeting to be held in Coos Bay, Oregon on Sept. 20th.

Recorder instructed to write the 1st National Bank in Coos Bay about proof of ownership of Fordson tractor.

Letter from State Hi-Way read.

Planning Commendations were read.

Recommendation #8: Fire regulations for new business bldg. construction.

The Planning Commission recommends that the City Council request the City Works Superintendent, Mr. Reed, to look into the newly adopted code to find out if it contains provisions for fire regulations for new business building construction and if it does not, the City Attorney, Mr. Ackley, be authorized to draw up an ordinance effecting such regulations. UNan. Carried.

Motion by Mr. Breuer, seconded Mr. Manley, Recommendation be tabled until Mr. Reed, Works Supt., has an opportunity to hear form letter about same. Carried.

Recommendation #9: Mail Chutes and the removal of two meters in front of the Post Office Bldg.

~~The Planning Commission recommends that the City Council grant the Post Office Department permission to install three mail chutes at strategic and convenient~~

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The Planning Commission recommends that the City Council grant the Post Office Department permission to install three mail chutes at strategic and convenient locations in the City, and the two meters in front of the Post Office be removed and the curb properly marked ten minutes parking. ~~Manley~~ ~~Carried~~

Motion Mr. Manley, seconded Mr. Breuer, the Council accept the recommendation #9 to the placing of the mail chutes and install two twelve minute parking meters instead of removing the present meters. Yelton aye, Manley aye, Breuer aye, Mayor Brimm aye. Carried.

Recommendation #10: Additional parking meter installations.

The Planning Commission recommends that the City Council install four parking meters on each side of Hillside Ave. and also as many meters on both sides of Fern Ave. as is found necessary.

Motion Mr. Breuer, seconded Mr. Yelton the Council except Recommendation #10 as recommended by the Planning Commission. Carried.

Recommendation #11: Overflow from septic system sanitary hazard.

The Planning Commission recommends that the City Council take steps to immediately remedy the sanitary hazard caused by a septic system opposite the new high school building.

Motion by Mr Yelton, seconded Mr. Breuer Recommendation #11 be excepted as recommended by the Planning Commission. Carried.

Mr. Reed reported Mrs. Gardner owner of the property had been to see him and the hazard would be taken care of immediately.

Mr. Reed reported he was sending a bulletin to all plumbing contractors about the bond required for installing septic tanks.

Recommended by the Council the cleaning of the parkings be paid out of the \$3000.00 emergency fund.

It was decided a letter be written to Mr. Morgan about the charge for the audit.

Motion by Mr. Breuer, seconded Mr. Manley, the bills be allowed. Carried.

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Mr. Thompson, chairman of the School Board was present and a patrol for the school children was discussed. The School Board asked the Council for a patrol at the intersection of 101 Hi-Way and ~~Hillside~~^{75th} between the hours of 7:30- 7:45, 11:20-12:30, 3:00-3:15, 5:00- 5:15. The Council agreed Chief Cross should have a meeting with Mr. Williams, School Supt. and work out a plan.

Cross walks will be painted next week.

House numbers are available. Mr. Reed reported he will keep a directory of the house numbers and names of persons in the City of Brookings.

Chief Cross asked the Council for a louder siren for his personal car, in as much as he uses his car in police work. Motion by Mr Breuer, seconded by Mr Yelton, Chief Cross be allowed to purchase such siren for his personal car and Mr. Yelton check on the insurance coverage. Also some means of ^{Police} identification be put on the Chief's car. Carried.

Mr. Thompson, asked about a Chief of Civil defence in Brookings. It is a new post requested by the Civil Defense Administration. The Council will appoint some one soon.

Chief Cross, reported there were 19 dog licences sold the preceeding Saturday. Total collected to date \$295.00, which was taken to the County Clerk and \$236.00 was returned to the City of Brookings.

Chief Cross, had negotiated with Mr. Nickols to empound the dogs and take care of them for \$20.00 a month. The markets in town will furnish the food.


Motion by Mr. Manley, seconded Mr. Breuer, fees from dog licenses be put in a special fund and checks be written from this fund to take care of same. Carried.
