## MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

OF THE CITY COUNCIL

OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, HELD

November 12, 1957

Meeting called to order by Mayor Campbell.

Councilmen Present: Councilmen Hanks and Hein,

Others: Attorney Balderree, Supt. Spencer, Bud Pisarek, and Mrs. A. V. Moore.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 8, 1957, were approved as read.

A letter from Ralph Reed requesting the privilege of submitting a bid for maintenance of parking meters was read. The council turned the letter over to the Chief of Police for consideration.

Mrs. Moore requested the council to issue a partial year's license for 1958 for seasonal occupations. The council assured her that she would be able to purchase a six month license next year. It was moved by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up an ordinance changing the expiration date of City licenses to July 1 to conform with the budget. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the tentative plans as modified by the council submitted by R. H. Erichsen be approved and the City Attorney be directed to proceed with the necessary legislation for election for a bond issue. Motion carried.

The matter of unsafe fireplaces was again discussed. The City Attorney told the council that the City should inform the homeowners of the unsafe condition but that the City was not obligated to fix the fireplaces.

ORDINANCE No. 109, an ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of City of Brookings Improvement Bonds in the sum of \$18,525.07, providing and approving the form of bonds to be issued and the coupons to be attached thereto, providing for the advertisement and sale of said bonds, and declaring an emergency was read the first time fully and distinctly at length. Thereupon Councilman Hanks moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and that said ordinance be read the second time by title only. This motion was seconded by Councilman Hein. The Mayor thereupon stated the motion and the vote resulted as follows:

"Ayes": Hanks, Hein and Campbell.

"Nays": None

"Absent": Breuer and Hagen

The Mayor then declared that said motion had duly carried and directed that Ordinance 109 be read the second time by title only. Said ordinance was thereupon read the second time by title only.

Thereupon CouncilmanHein moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and said ordinance be now passed to its third reading by title only and placed upon its final passage and be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Said motion was seconded by Councilman Hanks. The Mayor thereupon stated the motion and the vote resulted as follows:

"Ayes": Councilman Hanks and Hein and Mayor Campbell.

"Nayes": None

"Absent": Councilmen Breuer and Hagen.

The Mayor thereupon stated the motion had duly carried and directed that Ordinance No. 109 be read the third time by title only. Said ordinance was then read the third time by title only. Thereupon Councilman Hanks moved that the rules be suspended and an emergency declared and said ordinance be adopted. Said motion was seconded by Councilman Hein. The Mayor ordered that the roll be called and thereupon a roll call upon the final passage and the adoption of said ordinance was had and the vote resulted as follows:

"Ayes": Councilmen Hanks and Hein and Mayor Campbell.

"Nays": None

"Absent": Councilmen Breuer and Hagen.

Said Ordinance No. 109 having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have been duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

The bills were presented. A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the bills be paid. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks to adjourn until November 19, 1957.
