

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, HELD
February 11, 1958

The Council met in regular session at 8 o'clock, ^{February 11, 1958} ~~January 14, 1958~~.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Campbell.

Officers present: Mayor Campbell, Councilmen Hein, Breuer and Hanks, Attorney Balderree, Chief Cross and Recorder Huddleston.

Others present: James Kirby, Joseph Murphy, and Connie Bordwell.

Minutes of the regular meeting of January 14, 1958, were read and approved.

A letter from the State Highway Department and RESOLUTION NO. 33 in regard to making application for aid under the legislative act creating the annual Special City Allotment fund was read. A motion was made by Councilman Breuer and seconded by Councilman Hanks that RESOLUTION NO. 33 be adopted. Motion carried unanimously. A letter from R. H. Erichsen was read in regard to the Pump Station on Memory Lane and the condition of the manhole at Tanbark.

A letter from the Planning Commission in regard to appointing a new member to fill the vacancy for the expired term of Gordon Goetz was read. A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that Gordon Goetz be reappointed as a member of the Planning Commission for a term of four years, beginning April 21, 1958, and expiring April 21, 1962. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Breuer that Clive Manley be appointed as a member of the budget committee for a term of three years from February 1958 to February 1961. Motion carried unanimously.

A letter from the Richfield Oil Corporation in regard to a proposal for gasoline and diesel fuel was read. The City Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for fuel for the city equipment and police car.

The Chief of Police brought up the matter of minors operating pinball machines. The City Attorney was instructed to draw up an ordinance prohibiting anyone under 21 years of age to operate pinball machines.

Chief Cross also reported that the City can purchase a two-way radio system through the Civil Defense Agency at a saving. He was instructed to ~~investigate the matter further.~~ *purchase the radio equipment.*

A letter from Brizard-Matthews Machinery Company in regard to a contract was read. The council instructed Attorney Balderree to draw up a contract to submit to Brizard-Matthews on the grader and backhoe for their approval.

There was considerable discussion on the present parking meters. Chief Cross was authorized to install fifty manually operated meters to see if they would be satisfactory.

The bills were presented. A motion was made by Councilman Hein that the bills be paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Breuer.

It was moved by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the meeting be adjourned.
