

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, HELD
DECEMBER 8, 1959

THE COUNCIL MET IN REGULAR SESSION ON DECEMBER 8, 1959, AT 8:00 O'CLOCK P.M.

PRESENT WERE MAYOR CAMPBELL, COUNCILMEN HEIN, GOETZ, PHETTEPLACE AND HANKS, ATTORNEY BALDERREE, BILL SPENCER, BUD CROSS, BERNICE HUDDLESTON, CHARLES SABIN, GARY WIMBERLEY AND OTHERS.

THE CITY RECORDER OPENED AND THE COUNCIL CONSIDERED BIDS FOR A NEW POLICE CAR AS FOLLOWS:

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN HEIN AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ THAT THE BID RECEIVED FROM AKIN MOTOR COMPANY FOR A NEW POLICE CAR IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,063.34 BE ACCEPTED. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON NOVEMBER 10, 1959, WERE READ AND APPROVED.

MR. GRAYSHEL WAS PRESENT TO DISCUSS A MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT WITH THE HARBOR FIRE DEPARTMENT. THE COUNCIL INSTRUCTED HIM TO CHECK ON A SPECIMAN ORDINANCE THAT THE COUNCIL COULD ADOPT TO ESTABLISH THIS TYPE OF AGREEMENT.

SEVERAL PROPERTY OWNERS ALONG AZALEA PARK ROAD WERE PRESENT TO DISCUSS THE STATUS OF THE TWENTY FOOT STRIP OF LAND OWNED BY THE CITY FOR RIGHT OF WAY ALONG THEIR PROPERTY. MR. ECHOLS INFORMED THE COUNCIL HE HAD BEEN CHECKING ON THIS MATTER AND AS NEAR AS HE CAN DETERMINE FROM THE COUNTY RECORDS, THE CITY HAS CONTROL OVER THE STRIP AS RIGHT-OF-WAY ONLY AND HE THOUGHT THE PROPERTY OWNERS SHOULD TRY TO GET THE RIGHT-OF-WAY RESTRICTION CANCELED BEFORE ANY PORTION OF IT COULD BE DEEDED TO THEM.

MR. SABIN WAS PRESENT TO REQUEST THAT THE COUNCIL AUTHORIZE COTTAGE STREET TO BE USED AS A TRUCK ROUTE. AFTER CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION IN REGARD TO THIS MATTER, A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN HANKS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ THAT MR. BALDERREE BE INSTRUCTED TO PREPARE AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TRUCK ROUTE ORDINANCE TO INCLUDE COTTAGE STREET IN THE TRUCK ROUTES AND THAT A SPEED LIMIT OF 10 MILES PER HOUR BE DESIGNATED ON THE STREET. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

GARY WIMBERLEY WAS PRESENT TO REQUEST THE COUNCIL TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE BROOKINGS WATER COMPANY GIVING APPROVAL FOR MOVING THE FIRE HYDRANT IN FRONT OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH FOR INSTALLATION OF A SIDEWALK. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN HEIN AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN PHETTEPLACE THAT THE RECORDER WRITE A LETTER TO THE BROOKINGS WATER COMPANY CONFIRMING APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL TO MOVE THE HYDRANT AND THAT THE CATHOLIC CHURCH BEAR THE EXPENSE OF MOVING IT. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

A LETTER FROM THE CHETOO COMMUNITY PUBLIC LIBRARY WAS READ WHICH REQUESTED THAT MRS. DOLLY BRAINARD BE REAPPOINTED FOR ANOTHER FOUR YEAR TERM ON THE LIBRARY BOARD. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN HANKS THAT MRS. BRAINARD BE REAPPOINTED FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS ON THE LIBRARY BOARD FROM JANUARY 1, 1960. MOTION CARRIED.

CONTRACTS ON 110 NEW PARKING METERS WERE PRESENTED. A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN HEIN THAT THE MAYOR AND RECORDER BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN THE CONTRACTS FOR 110 NEW METERS AND SIX COIN BOXES AND THAT THE OLD CONTRACT BE CANCELED. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

A LETTER DATED NOVEMBER 27, 1959, FROM BLAIR J. AND PEGGY GOULD REQUESTING THAT THE CITY VACATE AN EASEMENT ACROSS THEIR PROPERTY WAS READ. THE COUNCIL INSTRUCTED THE RECORDER TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE GOULD'S INFORMING THEM THAT IT IS NOT THE INTENTION OF THE CITY TO RELINQUISH THE EASEMENT AND THAT SEWAGE FROM A FEW HOMES STILL CONNECTED TO THAT LINE WOULD BE ELIMINATED AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.

THE PLACING OF NEW STREET LIGHTS AT THE LIFT STATION AND AT PACIFIC AND AZALEA PARK ROAD INTERSECTION WAS DISCUSSED. MR. CROSS AND MR. ECHOLS WERE REQUESTED TO CHECK FOR SPOTS NEEDING STREET LIGHTS AND MAKE A REPORT TO THE COUNCIL AT THE NEXT MEETING.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN PHETTEPLACE AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN GOETZ THAT THE CITY HALL BE CLOSED ON SATURDAYS AND THE OFFICE BE OPENED EARLIER IN THE MORNING AND CLOSED LATER IN THE EVENING DURING THE WEEK. MOTION CARRIED.

APPRAISAL AND PURCHASE OF THE WATER SYSTEM WAS DISCUSSED. THE COUNCIL DECIDED THAT THE BUDGET COMMITTEE SHOULD BE REQUESTED TO INCLUDE AN AMOUNT IN THE NEXT BUDGET FOR APPRAISAL OF THE PRESENT SYSTEM. MR. CAMPBELL SAID HE WOULD CONTACT MR. ERICHSEN IN REGARD TO MAKING AN APPLICATION FOR A FEDERAL LOAN FOR A STUDY OF THE WATER SYSTEM ETC.

MR. ECHOLS WAS INSTRUCTED TO CHECK WITH RIVERSIDE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY IN REGARD TO A LADDER THEY WERE TO PROVIDE UNDER THEIR CONTRACT.

ORDINANCE No. 73 IN REGARD TO SIDEWALKS WAS DISCUSSED.

A DRAWING FROM O. E. DAVIS OUTLING A STREET HE WANTED TO DEED TO THE CITY WAS PRESENTED. THE COUNCIL INSTRUCTED THAT THE DRAWING BE GIVEN TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION FOR THEIR STUDY AND APPROVAL.

MR. ECHOLS PRESENTED A MAP SHOWING STREETS THAT HAVE NOT BEEN OFFICIALLY DEDICATED TO THE CITY. MR. BALDERREE WAS INSTRUCTED TO CHECK INTO THE MATTER AND DETERMINE WHAT PROCEDURE THE COUNCIL SHOULD TAKE TO GET THESE STREETS DEEDED TO THEM.
