MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

OF THE CITY COUNCIL

HELD IN BROOKINGS, OREGON

On March 10, 1959

The council met in regular session on March 10, 1959, at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Present were Mayor Campbell, Councilmen Hein, Goetz, Phetteplace and Hanks, Attorney Balderree, Bill Spencer, Ivan Smith, H. E. Echols, Judge Kirby, Chief Cross, Sam Hall, John Ebinger, Marva Weaver and others.

The minutes of the regular meeting held on February 10, 1959, were read and approved.

A petition from the people in the area of Fir Street requesting an open ditch to be filled was read.

An application from Oliver Moody as operator of the Sewage Disposal Plant was read. However, the city had previously appointed an operator.

A copy of a letter sent to Mrs. Lura Leonard by Mrs. M. Becker regarding the location of her property stakes was read. Mr. Echols was instructed to check the stakes and put them in plain view and the Recorder was instructed to advise Mrs. Becker accordingly.

A letter from Mr. Floyd A. Kindel dated March 4, 1959, was read regarding the sewer assessment lien on his property and asking the city to accept a deed on a Southwest corner lot owned by him in the City of Brookings for the sewer assessment. Mr. Balderree stated that the city had never received such a deed.

A letter from M. F. German in regard to the sanitary condition of his property was read. Mayor Campbell reported that the condition had been eliminated.

City Engineer Echols questioned the council as to his full authority as city engineer. The council informed him that all engineering must first be passed on by Mr. Echols. Also, all engineering of the city must meet his approval as well as all bills received from Mr. Erichsen before they are paid.

Mayor Campbell reported on reimbursements on rates for city employees on city business trips. It was agreed that actual expenses be paid as well as \$.08 per mile.

A letter from the Brookings Water Company was read in regard to constructing a water line for the new school. The council instructed Engineer Echols to make a study of the matter and write to the Brookings Water Company in regards to the location and depth of said water line.

A recommendation from the Planning Commission recommending that the 7.9 miles paving of the city streets be approved by the Council was read. The council tabled the recommendation until a map and investigation could be made.

Mr. John Ebinger, representing a delegation of citizens opposing the new cemetery site, stated that since the City had not received an application for the proposed cemetery that the group would return to be present at the hearing on March 18, 1959. Sam Hall, representing the Brookings Water Company in opposing the new cemetery site was also present. Mayor Campbell assured the group that the council would not take any hasty actions until every item was thorughly investigated and discussed.

A letter from Truman Ellis requesting an admendment to Ordinance No. 63 changing tariffs was presented. A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Hanks that the rates be approved and in effect until a new ordinance could be drawn installing the admendment. Motion carried.

Ordinance No. 125 repealing Ordinance No. 117, and changing the boundaries of certain zones in the City of Brookings as set forth in Ordinance No. 19 was read the second time fully and distinctly at length. A motion was made by Councilman Hein and seconded by Councilman Goetz that Ordinance No. 125 be accepted. The Mayor ordered that the roll be called and thereupon a roll call upon the adoption of said ordinance was had and the vote resulted as follows:

"Ayes": Mayor Campbell, Councilmen Hein, Goetz, Phetteplace, and Hanks.

"Nays": None "Absent": None

Said Ordinance No. 125 having received the required number of votes, the Mayor declared the same to have been duly passed and to have been duly adopted.

Building Inspector Smith was present to discuss charges for permits for the moving of buildings. Also the problem of dangerous unfinished constructions was discussed. The City Recorder was instructed to write a letter to the Brookings Bible Church requesting them to destroy or bring to code an unfinished garage that is a hazard to the community.
