RESOLUTION NO. XXXIV

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION THE QUESTION OF AN ANNUAL LEVY OF A DIRECT AD VALOREM TAX UPON ALL THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE SAID CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF CITY STREETS.

WHEREAS, extensive improvements to the City's streets are required in certain areas due to increased traffic and general use, and

WHEREAS, some portions of the City's streets are too narrow, other streets are poorly drained, and many streets are inadequate generally for present use, and the normal growth and development of the City compels the making of immediate plans for a street improvement program, including plans for the financing of such improvements, and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has conducted an extensive study of the City's street system, needs for improvement of the street system in certain areas, the City street department's facilities, and the projected growth of the City and its effect on the street development and maintenance program, and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has appointed a street improvement study committee and has considered and reviewed the reports of said committee members and has also held a public hearing with regards to street problems and proposed plans for the general improvement and modernization of city streets, and has determined that a serial tax levy is the most feasible and desirable method for raising funds necessary for financing the costs of the needed street improvements, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that a special election be and the same is hereby called to be held in the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, on the 18th day of May, 1962 at which time there will be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their

approval or rejection the question of imposing an annual levy of a direct ad valorem tax upon all the taxable property within said City in the amount of \$15,000.00, but not to exceed five (5) mills, and for each of the years commencing with the fiscal tax year July 1, 1962-63 tax rolls and continuing for each subsequent and successive year through the fiscal tax year 1965-66.

The tax measure to be submitted and the purpose for the same shall be as follows:

PROPOSED TAX LEVY SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS
BY THE COMMON COUNCIL:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON:

That a direct ad valorem tax be levied annually upon all the taxable property within the City of Canby, Oregon, in the amount of \$15,000.00, but not to exceed five (5) mills, and for each of the years commencing with the fiscal tax year July 1, 1962 - 1963, and continuing for each subsequent and successive year through the fiscal tax year 1965 - 1966, or for a total of four (4) years; that the purpose for such tax is to provide additional funds with which to construct, reconstruct, lay out, develop, widen, repair, maintain, resurface, pave, and improve generally the Canby city streets and all facilities and appurtenances necessary thereto or connected therewith, and including the installation and construction of gutters, storm sewers and drains, and at such times and in such places within the City as the City Council may deem advisable and in the best interests of the City; provide funds for the acquisition of additional land for street purposes; and provide funds generally for defraying any and all costs lawfully incurred by said City in the development, improvement and maintenance of the City's roads and streets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ballot title under which this proposed measure shall appear on the ballot shall be as follows:

PURPOSE: To provide funds for the improvement of City streets by levying annually a direct ad valorem tax upon all taxable property within the City of Canby in the amount of \$15,000.00 but not exceeding 5 mills, and for each tax year commencing July 1, 1962-1963 and continuing through tax years 1965-1966, which said funds will permit the Council for the City of Canby to develop, improve and maintain the City's roads and streets.

SHALL THE PROPOSED TAX BE LEVIED?

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Recorder of the City of Canby be and he is hereby ordered and directed to publish a notice of this election by posting a notice in ten (10) public and conspicuous places within the City of Canby at least ten (10) days prior to the date of said election, and which said notices shall set forth the time, place and purpose of said election, but need not contain the full proposed measure; and in addition the recorder shall cause to be published in the Canby Herald the proposed tax levy measure together with the ballot title and number of said measure, and the same shall be published once each week for two (2) successive weeks, the first publication to be not less than fifteen (15) days prior
