

RESOLUTION NO. LXII

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF ONE-HALF SHARE OF COSTS
FOR IMPROVEMENT OF IVY STREET CROSSING OF SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY
TRACKS.

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has requested the Southern Pacific Company to widen and improve the railroad crossing of Ivy Street, and the railroad company has agreed to such request, providing that the City share equally in paying the actual costs of such project; and

WHEREAS, the improvement project will entail a twelve foot extension of gumwood between the rails on the Company's main line and siding track, and a relocation of the crossing signal to a point approximately twelve feet west of its present position; and

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has studied the plan and the reports of the City Engineer and the recommendations of the City Police Department, and has determined that the proposed improvement project is essential in order to relieve the traffic congestion at said crossing and provide greater safety for pedestrian and vehicular traffic; and that the immediate improvement of the crossing and completion of the proposed project is in the best interests of the City and the inhabitants thereof, and essential to the health, peace and safety of, not only the inhabitants of the City of Canby, but all users of the railroad crossing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Canby City Council in special session convened this day and year as last appears hereunder that:


1. The City of Canby participate with the Southern Pacific Company in the improvement of the Ivy Street crossing by paying to the Southern Pacific Company, from funds to be budgeted for such purpose in the 1966-67 fiscal year, one-half of the actual costs incurred by said Company in the widening of the Ivy Street crossing and the relocation of the Ivy Street railroad crossing signal.


2. That the Budget Committee for the City of Canby be notified of the proposed improvement project and requested to include in the City's budget for the forthcoming fiscal tax year, a sum sufficient to cover the City's one-half share of such costs; and that the City Superintendent furnish to the Budget Committee a copy of any plans and specifications for the proposed improvement project, and an estimate of the City's costs.
