

ORDINANCE NO. 202

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE UNIFORM SIGN CODE FOR SIGNS AS SET FORTH IN THE 1967 EDITION TO SAID CODE.

THE CITY OF BROOKINGS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Ordinance No. 197 prohibiting commercial outdoor advertising type signboards and billboards, and providing penalties for violation thereof, passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor June 11, 1968, is hereby repealed.

Section 2: It is unlawful to erect or maintain any commercial outdoor advertising type of signboards or billboards within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings.

Section 3: The provisions of this ordinance do not apply to electric signs and transparencies or signs to any building advertising the business carried on in such building, nor bulletin boards, clocks or similar advertising devices.


Section 4: The provisions of this ordinance do not apply to signs not exceeding twenty (20) square feet in size, familiarly known as real estate signs, advertising for sale or rent the property upon which they stand, but all such signs shall be securely fastened to the ground or the structure to which they are attached.

Section 5: The Uniform Sign Code of 1967 is hereby adopted and shall apply to all signs within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings.

Section 6: Any person, firm or corporation upon conviction of a violation of this ordinance in the Municipal Court shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or not less than five (5) days nor more than fifty (50) days imprisonment in the city jail, or both such fine and imprisonment.
