

ORDINANCE NO. 165

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 5 OF ORDINANCE NO. 64, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF BROOKINGS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 5 of Ordinance No. 64 of the City of Brookings, passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on October 12, 1954, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 5: LIMITATIONS. No outdoor advertising structure or billboard shall be erected, placed or maintained in R1, R2, R3, or C1 Districts as such district or districts are defined in Ordinance No. 19 of the City of Brookings, this last said named ordinance No. 19 being the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Brookings, Oregon.

"From the date of the adoption of this Ordinance until the 1st day of AUGUST, 1962, no outdoor advertising structure or billboards shall be erected, placed or maintained in the City of Brookings nor any permits issued therefor without the unanimous approval of the Council."

WHEREAS, the Council is engaged in a study and investigation of the entire outdoor advertising and billboard problem and is seeking a pattern and course of action which will be most beneficial to the entire City of Brookings and its inhabitants, and no change should be made in the existing situation until such study has been concluded and definite conclusions reached and changes made, an emergency is hereby declared to exist in the interest of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings and the inhabitants thereof and this Ordinance may be introduced and placed upon all of its readings at any one meeting of the Council and shall be in full

force and effect from and after its passage by the Council
and approval by the Mayor.
