

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC BY
REQUIRING COMPLIANCE WITH STATE PUBLIC UTILITY
COMMISSION AND STATE BOARD OF HEALTH REGULATIONS
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

THE CITY OF BROOKINGS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: No person, firm or corporation, nor any employee, agent or representative of any such person, firm or corporation shall be given a permit to maintain or construct any electric lines, telephone lines, sewer lines, or water lines, that are subject to regulation by the Oregon State Board of Health or the Public Utilities Commission without first obeying and complying with all applicable rules, regulations and directives, and obtaining approval of said Oregon State Board of Health and Public Utility Commission.

Section 2: Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00, for each day of such violations or by imprisonment in the city jail for a period not to exceed 6 months, or by both.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that more effective and realistic provisions be made with regard to the matters in this ordinance for the purpose of protecting the public health and safety that such provisions should be put in effect without delay, an emergency is hereby declared to exist in the interest of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings and the inhabitants thereof, and this ordinance may be introduced and placed upon all of its readings at any one meeting of the Council and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
