

ORDINANCE NO. 1

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PROCEDURE FOR THE PASSAGE OF ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The City of Brookings does ordain as follows:

Section 1. ENACTING CLAUSE. The enacting clause for all ordinances shall be: "The City of Brookings does ordain as follows:".

Section 2. INTRODUCTION, READING AND PASSING. Every ordinance shall be fully and distinctly read in open Council meeting on two different days previous to being put upon its final passage, but any ordinance may be introduced, read twice, once in full and once by title, and put on its final passage, at a single meeting by a unanimous vote of all members of the Council present at the meeting. Upon the final vote, the ayes and naves of the members of the Council shall be taken and recorded in the journal. If the ordinance passes, the Recorder shall endorse it with the date of its passage and his name and the title of his office, and within three days thereafter, the Mayor shall sign it with the date, his name, and the title of his office.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. An ordinance enacted by the Council shall take effect thirty days after its enactment; provided, however, that any and all ordinances necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety shall take effect immediately upon its enactment by the Council.

Section 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its enactment.

Read by title and in full this 19<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1951.

Read a second time by title this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October, 1951.

Read a third time by title and passed by the Council this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October, 1951.
