

ORDINANCE NO. 60

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING OFFENSES AGAINST PERSONAL INJURIES AND INCONVENIENCE AND THE PUBLIC PEACE, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE; CREATING A NEW SECTION TO ORDINANCE NO. 13, OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 100-A; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF BROOKINGS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 100-A of ORDINANCE NO. 13. CONTROL OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to:

1. Pasture, stake out or keep or to allow any cow to be pastured, staked out or kept in an enclosure or an unenclosed lot or tract of land, when such cow is so staked, pastured or kept so that it can approach within twenty-five (25) feet of any building occupied or used by any person other than the owner or person in charge of said cow or so that it can traverse any public sidewalk or street. This section shall not be construed so as to permit the staking out, pasturing or keeping of any cow where said staking out, pasturing or keeping is regulated or prohibited by any other ordinance of the City of Brookings.
2. Permit any cow, horse, goat, sheep or other domestic animal kept in any enclosed or unenclosed lot or tract of land within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings to leave said place where said animal is so kept and wander at large within the corporate limits of the city.
3. Own, harbor or keep any dog which by biting or loud or frequent or habitual barking, yelping or howling shall cause annoyance to the neighborhood or to the people passing upon the streets or which shall destroy property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner thereof.

SECTION 100-B. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby adjudged and declared that the existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
