

ORDINANCE NO. 71.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A STREET WITHIN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, TO BE KNOWN AS ~~ARNOLD~~ ^{MOORE} LANE; ADOPTING THE BOUNDARIES OF SAID STREET; INCLUDING THE SAID STREET AS PART OF THE SYSTEM OF STREETS AND INTERSECTIONS OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS; AND DEDICATING THE SAID MOORE LANE TO THE PUBLIC USE.

The City of Brookings does ordain as follows:

Section 1. A city street to be known as Moore Lane is hereby created.

Section 2. The legal description of Moore Lane is hereby set forth as follows:

beginning at a point on the West boundary line of Arnold Lane, a city street, located North 126.20 feet and West 40.00 feet from the Southeast (SE) corner of Government Lot Two (2), Section Six (6), Township Forty-one, (41) South, Range Thirteen (13) West of Willamette Meridian in Curry County, State of Oregon; thence on the center line of said Moore Lane West 850.00 feet to a point which is the center of a circle with a thirty-five (35) foot radius, which is a turn-around area, and the terminal center line point of said Moore Lane, this said street being forty (40) feet in width, twenty (20) feet North of and twenty (20) feet South of the center line of Moore Lane here set forth and described.

Section 3. The said Moore Lane is hereby declared to be a duly created, established and existing street of the City of Brookings, Oregon, and the use thereof is hereby dedicated and conveyed to the public for the use by the public as a city street of the City of Brookings, Oregon.

Introduced by Councilman James Yelton at a regularly convened meeting of the City Council of Brookings, this 26th. day of April, 1955.

Upon motion of Councilman J. Yelton, and by the unanimous vote of all of the Councilmen present, this ordinance was read twice, once in full and once by title and placed upon its final passage:
