

ORDINANCE NO. 84

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, OREGON, ON Jan 20, 1956; FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY THE QUESTIONS OF APPROVING OR REJECTING THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF A SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY AND THE APPROVAL OR REJECTION OF A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND ISSUE IN THE SUM OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS TO APPLY ON THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF ACQUIRING AND CONSTRUCTING SAID SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM AND FACILITIES; PROVIDING FOR THE PROCEDURE OF SAID SPECIAL ELECTION; THE PREPARATION OF THE OFFICIAL BALLOTS THEREOF; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas, the Council of the City of Brookings, Oregon, has declared its opinion to be that it is necessary and essential to relieve unsanitary conditions by the construction of a sanitary sewer system, consisting of sewer mains and laterals, disposal plant, pumping stations and pressure lines, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the acquiring, constructing and method of payment of said sanitary sewer system and its facilities be referred to a vote of the qualified electors of the City of Brookings, Oregon, and

Whereas, the City Council has caused to be prepared plans, specifications and estimates of costs of such proposed facilities to be voted upon and that said plans, specifications and estimates of costs have been, and now are, on file in the Office of the City Recorder in the City Hall and which may be examined by any qualified elector of the City of Brookings, Oregon,

NOW THEREFORE:

The City of Brookings, Oregon, does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The propositions set forth in SECTION 2 of this Ordinance shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, Oregon, at a special election to be held Jan 20, 1956.

SECTION 2. At the special election to be held on Jan 20, 1956, there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, Oregon, for their approval or rejection the following propositions:

"Shall a sanitary sewer system and facilities be acquired and constructed within the corporate limits of the City of Brookings, Oregon, as said sewer system and facilities are set forth in plans, specifications, and estimates of cost thereof as the same are on file in the Office of the City Recorder?"

"Shall general obligation bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars be issued by the City of Brookings, Oregon to apply on the costs and expenses of the acquiring and constructing said sanitary sewer system and facilities?"

SECTION 3. (1) The regular polling places designated by the County Court of Curry County, in the voting precincts of the City of Brookings are hereby designated as the polling places for the aforesaid special election. (2) The poll books adopted by the said County Court for state-wide elections for the voting precincts of the City of Brookings are hereby adopted as the poll books for said voting precincts at said special election. (3) There is hereby named and appointed as the judges and clerks of the said special election and to act in said offices at said voting precincts as follows:

Precinct Number 1.

Judges: Russell Jenkins, Gladys Kanick, Ethel Molino

Clerks: Dorothy Kilpatrick, Matilda Pate, Marjorie E. Moore

Precinct Number 2:

Judges: Gladys L. Brainard, Verna Mendenhall, Elsa Ravekes

Clerks: Art Bollinger, Vera Whillock, Clarice Crook

(4) The aforesaid named and appointed judges and clerks shall hold their respective offices as of the aforesaid date of said special election.

(5) The polls for said special election shall be open in each of the said precincts at and during the same hours and said polls shall be opened at 8:00 o'clock A.M. and thereafter at all times continue to be open until closed at 8:00 o'clock P.M., on the date of said special election.

SECTION 4. Notice of the special election provided to be held on Jan 20th, 1956, shall be given not earlier than twenty (20) days and not later than ten (10) days before the election. This said notice shall issue under the seal of the City and over the signatures of the Mayor and City Recorder and shall be published in two (2) consecutive issues of the Brookings Harbor Pilot, a newspaper of general circulation published weekly in the City of Brookings and shall also be posted not later than twenty (20) days before said election in five (5) public places

in the City of Brookings, including the City Hall. The notice so published and posted shall be in the following form:

Notice of Special Election to acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system and facilities and to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds by the City of Brookings in the sum of \$50,000.00 to apply thereon.

On Jan. 20, 1956, in the City of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon, from 8:00 o'clock A.M. until 8:00 o'clock P.M. the following propositions will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Brookings, for their approval or rejection:

AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF A SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM AND FACILITIES.

Shall the City of Brookings, Oregon acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system and facilities within the corporate limits according to the plans, specifications and estimates of costs therefor as the same are on file in the City Hall of Brookings. " " " 54 166 Yes " " " 55 101 No

Shall the City of Brookings, Oregon authorize and issue general obligation bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars to apply on the acquisition and costs of construction of the sanitary sewer system and facilities authorized and approved by its electors. " " " 56 169 Yes " " " 57 102 No

The above propositions, if adopted, will authorize the City of Brookings, Oregon, to acquire and construct a sanitary sewer system within the corporate limits of the City and permit the City of Brookings to authorize and issue general obligation bonds in the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) to apply on the costs and expenses of such acquisition and construction thereof.

The total sum of general obligation bonds which are now, or have been, authorized and issued by the City of Brookings, Oregon, is "None".

SECTION 7. The City Recorder shall provide for the printing of the official ballot provided in Section 6, together with sample copies thereof, and provide for the proper distribution thereof, and shall provide and furnish to the polling places and judges and clerks thereof all of the necessary materials, official and sample ballots; registration and poll books; prior to the opening of the polls at the date of this aforesaid special election.

SECTION 8. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Brookings, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Moved by Councilman Manley, seconded by Councilman Breuer, that this ordinance be placed upon its passage, at this regular December ~~22nd~~ 1955, meeting of the Council.
