

RESOLUTION NO. CCLXXXIII (283)

RESOLUTION PRESCRIBING MONTHLY RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR SEWER SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has determined that there is a need for an increase in sewer rates to be charged to users of the City's municipal sewer system in order to keep pace with the rapidly increasing costs of operating, maintaining and repairing the City's sewage collection and treatment facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City's "Sewer" Ordinance No. 556, as amended by Ordinance No. 679, which was enacted and became effective August 6, 1980, expressly provides in Section 40 that the Council by resolution shall establish appropriate rates to be charged for monthly sewer services; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the rates hereinafter specified and hereby established, are just, reasonable and necessary; now therefore, it is hereby

RESOLVED that effective September 1, 1980, rates to be charged for City of Canby municipal sewer services are as follows:

<u>TYPE OF SERVICE</u>	<u>RATE PER CALENDAR MONTH</u>
A) Single family residential	\$6.40
B) Multi-family residential	6.40 for each unit having kitchen facilities.
C) Transient quarters	6.40 for first unit without kitchen facilities plus \$3.25 per calendar month for each additional unit without kitchen facilities.
D) Commercial	6.40 for first 10 employees of commercial establishments that are not engaged in preparation of food plus \$6.40 per calendar month for each additional unit of 10 employees or fraction thereof working on the premises.
E) Restaurants	0.40 per 100 cubic feet of monthly metered water consumption with minimum charge of \$17.
F) Industry (Commercial or industrial establishment other than restaurants that discharge process wastes to the sewage system. Industries that do not discharge process waste shall be charged at the applicable "commercial rate".)	To be established by special agreement between City and the Industry.

- G) Meeting Halls \$6.40 plus \$0.40 per calendar month for each fixture for the discharge of human waste, excluding the first four fixtures.
(Places of public meetings, including lodges, churches, labor halls, parks, and auditoriums not associated with schools.)
- H) Schools
(1) High School 0.50 per student for each calendar month from October through and including June. The monthly charge for the month of July, August and September shall be 25% of the charge for the previous month of June. Student enrollment shall be based upon the enrollment as of the previous first day of October.
(2) Grade and middle schools 0.50 per student shall be charged for each calendar month. Student enrollment shall be determined at the commencement of each quarter.
- I) Mobile Home Sites 6.40 for each space for a mobile home.
(A mobile home site or space shall be differentiated from a trailer or camping space by the availability of a sewer connection.)
- J) Trailer or camp site 6.40 for trailer or camp sites not having sewer connections at individual sites, plus \$1.60 per calendar month for each fixture for the discharge of human waste, excluding first four fixtures.
(Trailer or camp sites having sewer connections at individual sites shall be charged at the applicable "mobile home site" rate.)
- K) Convalescent and nursing homes 6.40 for first six beds plus \$1.05 per calendar month for each additional bed.
- L) Hospitals 12.80 for the first six beds plus \$2.10 per calendar month for each additional bed.
- M) Dormitories 6.40 for first six beds plus \$0.65 per calendar month for each additional bed.
- N) Car washes and laundries 0.40 per 100 cubic feet of monthly metered water consumption with a minimum charge of \$6.40 per month.

These sewer service rates as now established shall continue until changed by subsequent resolution of the Canby City Council; and the City Administrator shall notify the Canby Utility Board immediately of this rate change so that they will be included in billings for the month of September 1980, and thereafter.

ADOPTED by the Canby City Council at a regular meeting thereof on August 6, 1980.
