

RESOLUTION NO. CCCXI (311)

A RESOLUTION CALLING A PROPERTY TAX LEVY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 30, 1982 FOR FISCAL YEAR 1982-83.


BE IT RESOLVED that a property tax levy election be held in and for the City of Canby on Tuesday, March 30, 1982 between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m. at each of the regular polling places in and for the City of Canby for the purpose of submitting to the qualified legal voters of said City pursuant to LOCAL BUDGET LAW, and Article XI, Section 11, of the Oregon Constitution, the question of approving a property tax levy for that portion of the City's budget which exceeds its authorized tax base and which portion is partially State financed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the election hereby called shall be conducted by and through the County Elections Office as now required by law; and that upon the conclusion of the election, the results thereof be certified by the Clackamas County Elections Department to the Canby City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the form of the ballot for this matter and which was submitted by the City Administrator to the Clackamas County Elections Department and captioned "Tax Levy for City Budget up to 30% State Financed." is hereby approved. The amount of the budget which is outside the 6% tax limitation but will be financed partially by the State of Oregon and which requires voter approval is \$656,385.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that additional notices of this election (in addition to those being published by the County Elections Department in the Canby Herald) be given by the City Recorder as required by the Canby City Charter by posting at least ten (10) days prior to said election at each of the polling places in the City and also in three (3) other public and conspicuous places in the City.

ADOPTED by the Canby City Council at a regular meeting thereof on Wednesday, March 17, 1982.
