

RESOLUTION NO. 424

A RESOLUTION INCREASING SANITARY SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES,
ESTABLISHING A FEE FOR INDUSTRIAL WASTE PERMITS, AND
DEFINING THE METHOD FOR COMPUTING EQUIVALENT RESIDENTIAL
UNITS (ERU'S)

WHEREAS, the Canby City Council has determined that there is
a need for a change in the rates for sewer connection charges,
in order to provide proper funding for future expansion of
municipal sewer collection and treatment system as growth in the
City of Canby will require; and

WHEREAS, City Sewer Ordinance No. 727, which was enacted and
became effective January 1, 1983, expressly provides in Section
28 that the City Council by Resolution shall establish appropriate
rates to be charged for connection to the municipal sewer system; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 409, enacted March 3, 1959,
established a "Sewer Sinking Fund" to be used and expended for
the maintenance, extension, operation and enlargement of the
City's sanitary sewer system; and Ordinance No. 636, enacted
December 7, 1977, changed the name from "Sewer Sinking Fund" to
"Sewer Reserve Fund"; and all future collection for connection to
the City of Canby sanitary sewer system shall be deposited to the
"Sewer Reserve Fund"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the rates
hereinafter specified and hereby established are just, reasonable
and necessary, now therefore it is hereby

RESOLVED that effective September 1, 1988, nunc pro tunc,
rates to be charged for connection to the municipal sanitary sewer
system are changed to the following:

Single Family Residential	\$1,200/dwelling unit
Multi-Family Residential with Kitchen Facilities	\$1,200/first dwelling unit + \$900 each additional dwelling unit
Mobile Home Parks	\$1,200/first dwelling unit + \$900 each additional dwelling unit
Transient Quarters Without Kitchen Facilities	\$1,200/first sleeping room + \$600 each additional sleeping room
**Elementary School	\$1,200/per forty (40) students
**Junior & Senior High Schools	\$1,200/per twenty (20) students
Nursing Home	\$1,200/first two (2) beds + \$600 each additional bed
Hospitals	\$1,200/per bed
Churches	\$1,200/one hundred fifty (150) seats
Parsonage	+ \$1,200/additional
Child Care	+ \$1,200/forty (40) children
Business Office	+ \$1,200/1,600 sq. ft.
Evening Programs	+ \$1,200/1,600 sq. ft. (if more than 3 days or evenings per week)
Restaurant	\$1,200/eight (8) seats
Banquet Room	+ \$1,200/forty-eight (48) seats (banquet use only)
Tavern/Lounge	\$1,200/fifteen (15) seats (if separated from rest. seating)

Service Station	\$2,400 (first two (2) service bays and/or two (2) pumps)
Car Wash	
Wand	\$1,800/stall
Rollover	\$6,000
Tunnel	\$21,600
Laundromat	\$1,200/washing machine
Theater	\$1,200/sixty (60) seats
Bowling Alley	\$1,200/two (2) lanes including snack bar
Beauty Shop	\$1,200/up to eight (8) stations, prorate thereafter
Athletic Club	\$1,200/one hundred (100) members based on full projected membership
Commercial & Industrial (shall include all classes not otherwise included on this table)	The lessor of: A) \$1,200 (minimum) first 1,600 sq. ft. of interior floor space, prorated thereafter, or B) \$1,200 (minimum) first quarter acre of land area, prorated thereafter, but not less than 50% of maximum charge resulting from (A) or (B) above
Extra Strength Industrial	\$1,200/ERU as determined by Canby Wastewater Treatment Plant

****School charges based on actual enrollment (nonrefundable).**

NOTE: Equivalent Residential Unite = 200 GPD Sewage

These sewer connection and permit rates as now established shall continue until changed by subsequent Resolution of the Canby City Council.
