WHEREAS, Highway 99-E has long been one of Canby's most important resources; and

WHEREAS, the METRO 2040 Plan Preferred Alternative is expected to impact and affect Canby and it appears to be worthwhile to fully understand its impacts and effects; and

WHEREAS, as traffic and development along Highway 99-E increases, potential conflicts also increase; and

WHEREAS, the Kittleson Transportation System Plans for Canby will be finished by July 1, 1994, and aspects will need to be implemented through Ordinance and Comprehensive Plan Revision; and

WHEREAS, access management appears to have potential in aiding the process to keep the traffic and development related conflicts to a practical minimum; and

WHEREAS, new growth management tools such as Urban Reserves, Delayed Annexation and Revised County Urban Cooperation Agreements appear to have promise to aid Canby; and

WHEREAS, the City of Canby Planning Commission is the official Citizen Involvement Committee in regard to Comprehensive Planning, and the City Council is the official legislative body for Canby.
