

RESOLUTION NO. 625

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY TO
ADOPT THE GOALS AND BENCHMARKS OF THE GROWTH MANAGEMENT
II TASK FORCE AND ADD THEM TO THE VISIONING DOCUMENT OF
CANBY BY DESIGN THAT HAS BEEN DEVELOPED BY THE COMMUNITY.**

WHEREAS, it is critical to the greater community to have a vision of the future for this community; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of this community have come together to develop this vision; and

WHEREAS, visioning conversations have been taking place in the community since February 19th, 1994; and

WHEREAS, task forces have been working in the following specific areas: Education, Recreational Opportunities and Natural Resource Preservation, Diverse Economic Base and Family Wage Jobs, Community Involvement, Growth Management; and


WHEREAS, the visioning statement, and benchmarks for each task force except Growth Management II were previously adopted by the City of Canby City Council on the 18th day of October, 1995, in Resolution No. 594; and

WHEREAS, goals and benchmarks have now been developed by the Growth Management II Task Force and reviewed by the community; and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY that the City Council of the City of Canby adopts the attached goals and benchmarks for the Growth Management II Task Force and they will be added to the CANBY BY DESIGN document.

GOAL A: RETAIN THE UNIQUE CHARACTER OF CANBY AS AN AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY (Votes: 9 for, 0 against, 0 abstaining)

Benchmark 1: Number of events connected to farming in the greater Canby area to increase. (Votes 9 for, 0 against, 0 abstaining)

Explanation: To promote the farming in heritage by encouraging tours, displays, botanical gardens, farmers' market, community gardens, seasonal promotion, yard improvement, seminars, hayrides, adopt a park clubs, City entry displays, historic farm house tours, bicycle farm tours, dude farm (bed and breakfast), Farmin' Canby Days, Harvest Dance, Blackberry harvest Festival etc.

GOAL B: FUTURE GROWTH WILL BE OBTAINED BY INCREASING DENSITY WITHIN EXISTING URBAN GROWTH BOUNDARY BEFORE CONSIDERATION OF EXPANSION. WE WILL MAINTAIN SURROUNDING FARM LAND. WE ADOPT THE METHODS OF THE 1990 PARKS DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR GUIDANCE IN DEVELOPING FUTURE PARKS PLANS FOR THE COMMUNITY (Votes: 8 for, 1 against, 0 abstaining)

Benchmark 2: Number of housing units per acre within the City Boundary. (Vote: 6 for, 0 against, 0 abstained)

Benchmark 3: We measure the percentage of agricultural land between Canby's UGB and the boundary described by the Canby District plus, on the North side additional land between the school district boundary and Oregon City urban growth boundary between the Willamette River and Highway 213; excluding on the West side agricultural land west of Airport Road and excluding Charbonneau; also excluding on the south side agricultural land south of Whiskey Hill and Barnards Road.
