

## **RESOLUTION NO. 752**

### **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY RECORDER TO PROVIDE WORKER'S COMPENSATION COVERAGE FOR VOLUNTEER WORKERS, AND REPEALING RESOLUTION 730.**

**WHEREAS**, the Canby City Council wishes to protect its volunteer workers, with insurance protection for injuries arising out of or in the scope of their service to the City in accordance with ORS 656.031-041; and


**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Canby, as follows:

1. Pursuant to ORS 656.031, worker's compensation coverage will be provided for volunteer workers who perform work for the City of Canby, as set forth on the attached Volunteer Election form.
  - A. An assumed monthly wage of no less than \$800.00 will be used for public safety volunteers; and
  - B. Non-public safety volunteers will keep track of their hours and have their assumed payroll reported in the correct class code for the type of work being performed using Oregon minimum wage; and
  - C. Court-mandated community service workers, including juveniles referred from the Clackamas County Juvenile Department, and inmates on work release may be covered for worker's compensation benefits by the sentencing court. Coverage will be determined prior to work inception and stipulated to in writing between Canby and the respective sentencing court. Court-mandated volunteers will keep track of their hours and have their assumed payroll reported in Class Code 7720V using Oregon minimum wage; and
  - D. A roster of active volunteers (public safety, non-public safety and community service workers/inmates on work release) will be kept monthly for reporting purposes. It is acknowledged that the City/County Insurance Services may request copies of these rosters during year-end audit; and
  - E. Unanticipated volunteer projects or exposure not addressed herein will be added onto Canby's coverage agreement (1) by endorsement, (2) with advance notice to CIS, and (3) allowing two weeks for processing. It is hereby acknowledge that coverage of this type cannot be backdated.
2. Resolution 730 is hereby repealed.
