

RESOLUTION NO. 805

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON, CALLING AN ELECTION TO SUBMIT TO THE VOTERS OF CANBY A FIVE YEAR, LOCAL OPTION LEVY FOR POLICE SERVICES AT THE RATE OF \$1.40 PER \$1,000.00 ASSESSED VALUE BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2003/04.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon (the "City"), has determined that there is a need to acquire additional funds to restore police personnel, hire new police officers, provide equipment and materials to outfit and serve those additional officers and upgrade radios to the Clackamas County standard of 800 MHZ; and


WHEREAS, ORS 280.040 et seq. authorizes the City to submit a measure to City voters which, if approved, would allow the City to collect a local option tax levy for operational purposes; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Canby, Oregon that:


- A. An election is hereby called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City the question of authorizing a five-year local option levy in the amount of \$1.40 per \$1,000.00 assessed value per year, commencing in fiscal year 2003-2004.
- B. The election hereby called shall be held in the City on November 5, 2002. The election shall be conducted pursuant to ORS 254.465; and
- C. The City Recorder shall cause to be delivered to the Election Officer of Clackamas County, Oregon the attached Notice of Local Option Serial Tax Levy Election and Explanatory Statement for the Voter's Pamphlet, not later than 61 days prior to the election.
- D. That the City Recorder shall give notice of the election by posting the attached Notice of Election at a conspicuous place in City Hall and in a public place in each voting precinct in the City not less than ten days prior to the election.

This resolution will take effect July 3, 2002.

NOTICE OF LOCAL OPTION SERIAL TAX LEVY ELECTION

City of Canby
Clackamas County, Oregon

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on November 5, 2002, an election will be held by mail in Clackamas County, Oregon. The following question will be submitted to the qualified voters thereof:

MEASURE No. 3-72

CAPTION: FIVE-YEAR LOCAL OPTION LEVY FOR LOST/ ADDITIONAL POLICE SERVICES.

QUESTION: Shall the City levy \$1.40 per \$1,000.00 of assessed property value annually for five years 2003-2008 for police services?

This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

SUMMARY: This levy would restore police personnel, hire new police officers, provide equipment and materials to serve those additional officers, and provide a mandatory radio upgrade to Clackamas County's 800 MHZ standard. This levy is based on a fixed rate of \$1.40 per \$1,000.00 of assessed property value. The average home in Canby has a market value of \$175,000.00; however, taxes are calculated on the homes assessed value of \$134,500.00 according to the Clackamas County Assessor. Using this example, the annual increase in property taxes would be approximately \$188.00 per year. This levy would be effective for five years, beginning in fiscal year 2003-2004. The estimated total amount of money to be raised by this local option levy is \$5,664,323.00 with the estimated amount raised each year as follows:

2006-2007	\$1,186,681.00
2007-2008	\$1,246,015.00

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT FOR VOTERS PAMPHLET

MEASURE APPROVING A FIVE-YEAR SERIAL TAX LEVY FOR THE CANBY POLICE DEPARTMENT

Measure No. 3-72

Word Total 307 (500 max)

This measure would approve a \$5,664,323.00 police serial tax levy over the next five years. The purpose of the levy would be to provide funding to replace two police patrol positions that were eliminated in the 2000-2001 budget and enable the City to increase the staff of the Canby Police Department continually over the next five years in order to keep pace with expected population growth within the City.

Passage of the levy would also allow the police department to upgrade existing computer equipment and add police vehicles needed for the daily operation of the police department. The levy would provide the necessary funds to convert to a mandatory 800 MHZ radio system that is required by all public safety members using the Clackamas County Communications system.

Due to the loss of a records clerk, a result of budget cuts, the police department's public access window is now only open as volunteers are available. Also due to budget cuts, two Community Service officers were eliminated resulting in greatly reduced enforcement of Municipal Code violations. The Passage of the police levy would add three people to restore these services. Over the remaining five-year period, the levy would add two additional detective positions, one patrol officer each year, and one patrol supervisor.

The levy is based on a fixed rate of \$1.40 per \$1,000.00 of assessed property value. The average home in Canby has a market value of \$175,000.00; however, taxes are calculated on the assessed value of \$134,500.00 according to the Clackamas County Assessor. For example, the estimated annual increase in property taxes would be an additional \$188.00 per year. $(\$134,500 \times \$1.40) / \$1,000.00 = \188.00
