

## Ordinance No. 96.

An ordinance providing for the prevention and removal of all obstructions from the sidewalks and for the clearing of the same.

Sec. 1. <sup>Canby does provide as follows:</sup> It shall be unlawful for any person or persons in business or otherwise within the corporate limits of Canby to cause or permit any display of groceries, vegetables or merchandise of any character whatsoever to occupy a space of more than fourteen (14) inches on the inside of the sidewalks and the same to be displayed on a shelf not less than two (2) feet above the level of said sidewalks.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to allow display shelves to remain upon the sidewalks, after said displays are removed within the places of business, during the night unless such shelves are on hinges and can be dropped against the sides of the buildings when used without extending or protruding so as to make them dangerous.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to wholly or partially obstruct the sidewalks with scales, beer coops, boxes of any kind, fuel or the fastening of tin or metal signs to the sidewalks or any other obstructions which may interfere with pedestrians passing along the sidewalks, except in the case of a building permit.

Sec. 4. Any person or persons violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Mayor or Recorder shall be fined in the sum of not less than five (5) dollars nor more than twenty five (25) dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail, not less than two (2) days nor more than ten (10) days, or both.
