

## ORDINANCE NO. 100

AN ORDINANCE FORBIDDING THE HOLDING, STORING, OR KEEPING OF POWDER AND GASOLINE IN GREATER QUANTITIES THAN HEREINAFTER PROVIDED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF CANBY, OREGON.

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the corporate limits of Canby to keep, hold, or have in their possession any explosive powder in greater quantities than 50 pounds within a distance of 200 yards of any building or structure; provided, however, that they may keep such reasonable larger quantities as the trade or circumstances demand stored in a building or pit designated for that purpose and plainly so marked and at a distance of not less than 200 yards from any building or structure.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons within the corporate limits of Canby to keep, hold, or have in their possession gasoline in any other than sealed original packages, unless it be kept in an approved underground tank; provided, however, that each place of business or person or persons may have one and only one five-gallon original package of gasoline open at any one time.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating or failing to comply with the provisions or any of them of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof before the mayor or recorder, shall be fined in a sum not more than \$50 nor less than \$10.

Section 4. This ordinance shall go into effect and be of full force and vigor from and after its final passage and approval by the mayor. This ordinance was read, approved, and ordered posted by the unanimous vote of the council, April 3, 1911.

Posted April 4, 1911. Read for the second time and passed by an unanimous vote of the council May 1, 1911.
