

## Ordinance No. 67.

An Ordinance for the Construction of Certain Sidewalks and Crosswalks in the City of Canby, Oregon, and to appropriate money therefor.

Canby does Ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. The proposed improvement of that part of the Sidewalks and Crosswalks lying on the North Side of Second Street between the west line of B. Street, and the west line "E" Street, and the following Sidewalks and Crosswalks between North line of first Street, and North line of Second Street, to wit: on west side of B Street, on west side of "D" Street, and on East side of "E" Street, shall be Completed within such time as the Council may designate.

Sec. 2. The Sidewalks shall be constructed six (6) feet in width as follows to wit: Planking  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches thick 6 ft long, and Eight (8) inches wide dressed on one side, and resting on four (4) stringers, 2 x 6 inches and laid with broken joints, the Sills or blocks to be six (6) ft long, and from 2 to 4 inches wide and 4 inches thick and laid not more than 4 feet apart, planking to be nailed with 16<sup>d</sup> wire Nails, 2 at each bearing. All crosswalks to be six (6) ft wide, made of fir planking 3 x 12 inches securely spiked to Sills of Cull Ties, imbedded in earth, the bed pieces or Sills to be sloped at each end, so that one plank at each side of the walk will lay on a slope and all spiked down with six (6) inch wire Nails.

Sec. 3. The Entire improvement herein Contemplated shall be done in accordance with this Ordinance. The City of Canby to furnish all material necessary for the construction thereof, and the laying down of said Side and Crosswalks shall be done under the Supervision of the Street Superintendent, all the lumber to be of sound fir, free from Sap, and large knots and pitch seams.

Sec. 4. The expense account for the whole improvement shall be paid out of the general fund of the city of Canby.
