

Ordinance No. 72.

Curfew Law,

Entitled an Ordinance to Prohibit Minors from being on the Streets, after certain hours of the night:

Canby does Ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any Minor to be on the Streets, Alleys or in any public places, within the Corporate limits of Canby during the evening or night after the hours of 9. O'clock P. M. from March 1st to October 31st, and after 8. O'clock P. M. from November 1st to March 1st except as hereinafter provided;

Sec. 2. That no Minors or parties heretofore mentioned shall be deemed a violator of the foregoing section when accompanied by and in the presence of the Parent or guardian of said minor, nor when going to or returning from his or her place of work, nor in any case of actual urgent or imperative necessity, or by presenting to the officers making the arrest, a written permit from the Parent or guardian of such Minor, authorizing such Minor, to be and appear on the Streets for purposes stated in permit, and on immediate return. Such permit shall be dated of the day when used, and contain the name of such minor, and be signed by the Parent or guardian thereof. The Chief of Police, or any regular or Special Policeman shall take up all permits when exhibited and file the same with the City Recorder,

Sec. 3. Any Minor found guilty before the Recorder or Mayor of a violation of this Ordinance, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding (\$10.00) ten dollars, or imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding 5 days, or fine and imprisonment both in the discretion of the Court. Provided that the Court may have the discretion to remit

such fine, or imprisonment or both for the first offense, upon the recommendation of the Chief of Police or officer making the arrest, or in the discretion of the Court, or may suspend sentence and judgment for any period subject to good behavior,

Sec. 4. The Chief of Police shall cause a fire bell or gong to be rung or sounded fifteen minutes before the time named in section one (1) and again at said time mentioned in said Ordinance

Sec. 5. This Ordinance repeals and annuls, any and all Ordinances heretofore passed that conflict with this Ordinance.

Sec. 6. This Ordinance to take effect from and after its final passage and approval by the Mayor.
