

Ordinance No. 73.

To Prohibit Gambling.
 Entitled an Ordinance to Prohibit gambling
 and Public Gaming in the Town of Canby.

Canby does Ordain as follows:-

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or firm carrying on or engaged in any trade or business within the Corporate limits of Canby to permit any person to engage in or carry on or take part in any game of chance, whereby anything or article of value, or any pledge is put up, or wagered on the result of said game of chance played, or to be played, or carried on in or about their place of business.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or firm, carrying on, or engaged in any trade, or business, or carry on in any public place within the Corporate limits of Canby, where minors are allowed to be or frequent. To allow any minor to shake dice, or play cards, or other game of chance, whether for some consideration of value or otherwise,

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any minor to play cards, shake dice, or play any game of chance in any public place in the Corporate limits of Canby;

Sec. 4. Any person found guilty under this Ordinance, before the Mayor or Recorder shall be punished by a fine in a sum not less than (\$5.00) five dollars, nor more than (\$20.00) twenty dollars, or imprisonment in the City Jail not less than 2 days, nor exceeding 10. days, or fine and imprisonment both in the discretion of the Court;

Sec. 5. This Ordinance repeals any and all Ordinances heretofore passed that conflict with this Ordinance.

Sec. 6, This Ordinance to take effect from and after its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

To purchase a Bell
 Entitled an Ordinance to purchase a Bell
 for the use of Canby.

Canby does Ordain as follows.

Sec. 1. The Town of Canby hereby believes it necessary, and by reason thereof proposes to purchase a Bell and erect the same in a proper place in said Canby for and to be used as and for a fire. Curfew, or, and any other use or alarm that may be necessary or useful in said Canby.

Sec. 2. The Appropriation of Money for the same to be made out of the General fund of the said Canby.

Sec. 3, This Ordinance to take effect from and after its final passage and approval by the Mayor.
