## ORDINANCE NO. 133.

An Ordinance directing and instructing the Mayor and Recorder of Canby to enter into a lease agreement with the Southern Pacific Company for the purpose of securing the right to lay water mains under the track and on the right of way of the said Company, and providing for the payment of One Dollar per year for said right, and declaring an emergency.

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor and Recorder of Canby are hereby directed and instructed to execute for Canby a written lease with the Southern Pacific Company, a copy of which lease was filed in the Recorder's office September 1, 1916, in which lease the City of Canby will secure the right to lay and maintain water pipes and mains under the tracks and on the right of way of the said Southern Pacific Company.

Section 2. That Canby shall pay the Southern Pacific Company, as therein set out the sum of One Dollar per year for said privilege.

Section 3. Whereas Canby is constructing a municipal water system, in order to furnish the citizens thereof with an adequate supply of pure water for house hold use and for fire protection, now therefore, an emergency is hereby declared, and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its passage and approval by the mayor, in order to protect the health and safety of Canby.

Said ordinance was read for the first time at the meeting of September 11, 1916 and ordered posted for the reason that charges of publication, were, in the judgment of the council excessive, and to c me for final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held on October 16, 1916.
