

ORDINANCE NUMBER 140.

An ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax of Two thousand seven hundred forty two dollars (\$2,742.00) on all the taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Canby, and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City Council of Canby does hereby levy a tax of Two thousand seven hundred forty two dollars (\$2,742.00), on all taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for State and County purposes within the corporate limits of Canby, to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon. by the Treasurer and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1918 with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1917.

Section 2. That whereas, it is necessary that said tax levy be made and the record thereof be in the hands of the Assessor of Clackamas County before December 1st, 1917, in order that said levy may be made, which said levy is made to protect the peace, health and safety of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared, and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Moved and seconded that said ordinance be placed upon its first reading and that same be published. Motion carried.

This ordinance to come up for final passage at a special meeting to be held Nov. 19th, 1917.
