

ORDINANCE NO. 118

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SIZE AND THE FILING OF MAPS AND PLATS WITH THE CITY RECORDER OF THE CITY OF CANBY AND REQUIRING THEM TO BE APPROVED BEFORE THEY ARE FILED AND PRESCRIBING THE FILING FEE THEREFOR.

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. All maps offered for record to the city recorder shall be made in black India ink, upon good quality of white, cold-pressed, double-mounted drawing paper 18 inches by 24 inches in size, with a muslin extending 3 inches at one end for binding purposes. The plat, diagram, or drawing shall be of such a scale and the lettering thereon shall be of such size as will permit the whole thereof to be placed on one sheet of paper but no part thereof (to) come nearer the edge of the sheet of paper than 1 inch. All of such map or plat shall be on one side or page of the sheet.

Section 2. Every map or plat shall have thereon an affidavit, of the person filing or of the person who drew such map or plat, that said map or plat is a true and correct diagram and representation of the subject matter thereof.

Section 3. The committee of the council of the city of Canby, known as the committee on streets and public buildings, shall approve of all such maps before the said map or plat is filed by the city recorder, and their approval shall be endorsed on the back side of such map or plat.

Section 4. The city recorder shall charge the sum of 50 cents for filing such map, and of such sum he shall receive one half, and the balance shall be paid into the city treasury.

Read for the first time and ordered posted at a special (meeting) of the city council of the city of Canby, held on this 22nd day of July A.D., and to come up for passage at a regular meeting of said council to be held on the 7th day of September A.D., 1914, at 8 p.m.
