An Ordinance appropriating the sum of Three Hundred Dollars, for the purchase of land, necessary, that C. Street may be opened.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS.

Section 1. That the sum of Three Hundred and no/100 (\$500.00) Dollars be and is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the City of Canby, to be paid to Dr. H. A. Dedman, for a strip of land, in Dedman's Addition to the City of Canby, being 52 feet in width and 264 feet in length, which strip of land is necessary to the City of Canby, so that C. Street may be opened from the South line of the Oregon and California Railroad right-of-way in the City of Canby, to Maple Street.

Read for the first time and ordered posted at a regul ar meeting of the^City Council of the ^City of Canby held on the 14th day of September, A.D. 1914, and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the said Council to be held at two o'clock on the 2nd day of November, A.D. 1914.
