

ORDINANCE NO. 123.

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax of seven and one-half mills on all the taxable property, both real and personal within the City of Canby.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the City Council of Canby does hereby levy a tax of seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) mills on all the taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for state and county purposes within the corporate limits of the City of Canby, to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Treasurer and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1916, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1915.

Read for the first time and ordered posted at the regular meeting of the Council of the City of Canby held on the 1st day of November, A.D. 1915, and to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the said Council to be held on Monday, the 22nd day of November, A.D. 1915, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. at the City Hall."

Ordinance No. 123 being an ordinance providing for the levying of a tax levy for the City of Canby, during the year 1916, entitled "An ordinance for the purpose of levying a seven and one-half mill tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within the City of Canby read for the first time at a regular meeting of the City Council held on the 1st day of November, 1915, and to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the City Council to be held on Monday, the 22nd day of November, A.D. 1915, at 7:30 o'clock P.M. at the City Hall.
