

ORDINANCE # 331.

AN ORDINANCE SPECIFYING THE WIDTH OF CITY STREETS WHICH MAY HEREAFTER BE PRESCRIBED DEDICATED OR LAYED OUT WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN:

- Sec. 1 All streets that may be prescribed, dedicated or layed out from and after the passage of this act, shall be not less than sixty (60) feet in width.
- Sec. 2 The width of all sidewalks, parking strips and curbing that may be built on either side of such streets, shall be determined and governed by the City Council, which body shall have the power and authority to specify the widths thereof in the resolutions ordering such sidewalks, parking strips and curbing.
- Sec. 3 All grades of any such streets shall be done in accordance with the specifications prepared by the City Engineer or Street Superintendant, and as designed by the resolution ordering such improvement.
- Sec. 4 The City of Canby will not assume jurisdiction over any such streets hereafter prescribed, dedicated or layed out, which shall not comply with the width above prescribed, and will not be responsible for its upkeep or improvements.
