

ORDINANCE NO. 344.

WHEREAS, it has become apparent, and it is found necessary, convenient and expedient, that the Canby Fire Department be in possession for its use of a recussitator, for restoring any City of Canby Fireman, or any other person who may be overcome from heat or smoke in the event of any fires that may arise; and

WHEREAS, the cost of such recussitator is in the neighborhood of \$400.00, and the City of Canby Fire Department is ready and willing to pay one half the cost of such recussitator, provided the City of Canby will pay the other one half of such cost; and

WHEREAS, the City of Canby Fire Department is composed of members who are residents of the City of Canby, Oregon, and without pay or remuneration, and wholly voluntary; and

WHEREAS, it is considered a moral and public duty for the City of Canby, to participate in the purchase with the City of Canby Fire Department members of such recussitator, for the protection of the said City Fire Department members, and such of the general public who may require its use.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN:

Section 1- That the City of Canby does hereby contribute to the City of Canby Fire Department, the sum of \$200.00, as its one half share in the payment for such recussitator.

Section 2- It being hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions require the purchase of such recussitator for the protection of the City of Canby Fire Department members, and the general public at large, and that it is a convenience, benefit and advantage for the general use, and that this act is necessary for the immediate necessity of the general public at large for the preservation and protection of the general health and safety, and for the preservation of the peace and dignity of said City of Canby, Oregon; and that it is hereby declared that an emergency exists, and this act shall take effect and will be in force from and after its passage.
