## ORDINANCE NO. 344

WHEREAS, it has been apparent for several years last past that motor vehicles are driven over, upon and through the streets of Canby, Oregon, at a reckless speed, and upon the Facific Highway No.99E, within the City Limits of said City of Canby, Oregon, to such an extent that an emergency has now arisen making it necessary for the protection of life, limb and property of pedestrians and the general public at large within the City Limits of said City of Canby, Oregon, that steps be taken by the City Council of said City of Canby, Oregon, through its police power and department, that such reckless operation of motor vehicles and excessive speeds be curbed; and for that purpose it is necessary for said City of Canby, Oregon, tp purchase a prowl car to apprehand, capture and arrest all such reckless operators of any motor vehicles at such excessive speeds within the said City Limits of said City of Canby, Oregon; and for the accomplishment of this purpose, CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1- That the City of Canby, Oregon, purchase a prowl car, for the purpose of apprehending, capturing and arresting violators of the speed laws, reckless driving and operation of motor vehicles over, upon and through the streets of said City of Canby, Oregon, as well as on the Pacific Highway No.99E within the City Limits of said City of Canby, Oregon. Section 2- That said prowl car be purchased at as low a price as possible, not to exceed \$1,500.00, fully equipped for this purpose, and in good condition Section 3- Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate protectic preservation and safeguard of the life, limb and property of pedestrians and the general public at large within the City Limits of Canby, Oregon, and since an emergency exists, that this ordinance shall be in force and effect immediaately from and after its passage by the City Council and approved by the Mayor.
