SECTION 2—That the cost of this oiling of said streets shall be assessed and paid by all property owners adjacent to the said streets or avenues, who are benefitted thereby, and prorated in accordance with the front footage owned by each such owner, and a lien is hereby declared to exist against such properties until such cost and assessment shall have been paid in full, yearly.

SECTION 3—It hereby is adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety, and that an emergency hereby is declared to exist and that this ordinance take effect and be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

## ORDINANCE No. 366

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE OILING OF SOUTH SIXTH AVENUE FROM FIR TO ELM; FROM SIXTH TO FOURTH FIFTY FEET SOUTH FROM SIXTH ON ELM, ONE HUNDRED TEN FEET SOUTH FROM SIXTH ON FIR, PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT AGAINST THE PROPERTIES BENEFITTED BY SUCH OILING.

WHEREAS a petition was signed and presented to the City Council of Canby, Oregon, signed by the adjacent property owners of the lots adjacent to the streets and avenues above named, asking that the said streets and avenues receive a treatment of oil each year for a period of three years beginning with the present year of 1952, and that the costs shall be assessed and paid by all owners of property adjacent to the streets or avenues mentioned, prorated in accordance with the front footage owned by each.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1—That in pursuance of said petition and the pledge therein expressed, the Superintendent of Public Works be and he hereby is authorized, ordered and directed to arrange for the oiling of said South 6th Avenue from Fir to Elm Street
