

ORDINANCE No. 368

AN ORDINANCE to make Southwest Fourth Avenue, in the City of Canby, Oregon, from "Fir Place" to Elm Street, in said City of Canby, Oregon, a 40 foot street.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1—That Southwest Fourth Avenue, in the City of Canby, Oregon, from Fir Place to Elm Street, shall be widened to not less than 40 feet, and that no side-walks shall be built on said right-of-way.

Section 2—It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, Oregon, and that this ordinance shall in no manner affect or repeal previous action by the City Council

declaring that all streets within the corporate limits of the City of Canby, Oregon, shall be 60 feet in width; and owing to the urgent necessity of making said street, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Read for the first time and ordered to be published at the regular meeting of the City Council held on the 4th day of August, 1952, and to come up for final passage, September 2, 1952.
