

**ORDINANCE No. 369**

AN ORDINANCE to make Northwest Sixth Avenue, in Canby, Oregon, West from Grant Street to the Jack Meek property in said City of Canby, Oregon, a 40 foot street.

**THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1 — That Northwest Sixth Avenue in the City of Canby, Oregon, West from Grant Street to the Jack Meek property, being approximately 538 feet, and ending in a dead end street, shall be widened to not less than 40 feet. That no sidewalks shall be built on said right-of-way.

Section 2—It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, Oregon, and that this ordinance shall in no manner affect or repeal previous action by the City Council declaring that all streets within the corporate limits of the City of Canby, Oregon, shall be 60 feet in width; and owing to the urgent necessity of making said street, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage. Read for the first time and ordered published at the regular meeting of the City Council held on the 4th day of August, 1952, and to come up for final passage September 2, 1952.
