

AN ACT.

RELATING TO CITY ORDINANCE No. 314 GOVERNING RULES, RATES AND REGULATIONS OF CANBY LIGHT AND POWER, ADOPTED APRIL 7, 1941, AMENDING SCHEDULE 2 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL LIGHTING AND POWER RATES.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Schedule 2 of Ordinance No. 314, governing rules, rates and regulations of Canby Light and Power, relating to Commercial lighting and power rate is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1- AVAILABILITY.

Applicable to all commercial and non-residential light, heat and power customers. Energy supplied under this schedule shall not be submetered for resale or resold to others.

RATES.

Energy charge: First 150 kw-hrs., used per month at 2 1/2¢ per kw-hr.
Next 350 kw-hrs. used per month at 1 1/2¢ per kw-hr.
Next 1000 kw-hrs. used per month at 1¢ per kw-hr.
Next 13,500 kw-hrs. used per month at 0.7¢ per kw-hr.
Next 50,000 kw-hrs. used per month at 0.5¢ per kw-hr.
Excess above 65,000 kw-hrs. used per month at 0.3¢ per kw-hr.

Demand Charge: First 10kw of demand per month, no demand charge.
Excess above 10 kw. of demand per month, at 95¢ per kw.

For customers with demands greater than 10 kw the energy charge for use in excess of 360 times the demand shall be reduced 50% from the otherwise applicable rate, except that no energy shall be billed at less than 2 1/2 mills per kilowatt- hour.

DETERMINATION OF DEMAND.

Demand measurement shall be made by suitable instruments as the point of delivery. Demand for any month shall be defined as the average kilowatt delivery during the 30 minute period in which the consumption of energy is the greatest during the month for which determination is made.

ADJUSTMENT OF DEMAND CHARGES FOR POWER FACTOR.

Demand charges shall be adjusted for customers with 50 kilowatts or more of measured demand to correct for weighted average power factors lower than 85%, and may be so adjusted for other customers if and when the City deems necessary. Such adjustments will be made by taking .85 of the demand determined as stated above, and dividing this amount by the weighted monthly average power factor.

MINIMUM CHARGES.

For customers with 10kw or less of measured demand the net monthly minimum bill shall be \$1.00 for each meter. For users whose measured demand in any of the past eleven months exceeds 10kw the minimum charges shall be as follows:

The minimum monthly bill during the service period shall be 60% of 95 times the highest demand during the preceding eleven calendar months.

PAYMENT.

The above rates are net, the gross rates being 5% higher on the first \$25.00 and 1% on the remainder of the bill. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen days from date of bill, the gross rates shall apply.

DELIVERY POINT.

The above rates are based upon the supply of service through a single delivery and metering point, and a single voltage and phase. Separate supply for the same customer at other points of consumption, or at a different voltage, or phase, shall be separately metered and billed.

CONTRACT REQUIREMENT.

Customers whose measured demand in any month exceeds 10kw may be required to execute contract for a minimum term of one year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Service under this classification is subject to the Rules and Regulations of the City.

IRRIGATION SERVICE, Availability.

Available for power on a continuous basis for irrigation pumping from April to September, inclusive. Pumping service shall be available during the balance of the year but may be interrupted at the discretion of the City for the periods not to exceed four hours in any one day.

TYPE OF SERVICE.

Alternating current, three phase, 60 cycle, at available secondary voltage. At the discretion of the City, single phase service may be furnished provided the motor capacity is not in excess of 10 h.p.

RATE.

Plant Rental Charge: 10% of special investment to serve irrigation load, including service line, transformers, meter, etc. but not including any part of the backbone system investment.

Demand Charge: \$1.25 per kw of demand per month.

Energy Charge: First 200 kwh per kw of demand per month at 3.5 mills per kwh. Over 200 kwh per kw of demand per month at 2 mills per kwh.

The plant rental charge will be billed in three equal monthly installments beginning with month when irrigation normally commences.

DETERMINATION OF BILLING DEMAND

The demands caused by irrigation pumping will be metered if reasonably practicable; where metering is impracticable, such demands shall be estimated from the connected load and method of operations of the pumping equipment on the basis of suitable field tests. When the demand is indicated or recorded by demand meter, it shall be the maximum 30-minute registered demand during the month for which the bill is rendered.

MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE.

The minimum annual charge shall be the plant rental charge.

POWER FACTOR.

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. The City reserves the right to measure such power factor at any time. Should such measurements indicate that the average power factor is less than 95%, the demand for billing purposes shall be increased 1% for each 1% or major fraction thereof by which the average power factor is less than 95% lagging.

DELIVERY POINT.

The above rates are based upon the supply of service through a single metering point at one voltage and phase. If additional service is required by the same customer at other points of delivery or at different voltage or phase, such service shall be metered and billed separately under the appropriate rate schedule.

TERMS OF PAYMENT.

The above rates are net, the gross rates being 5% higher on the first \$25.00, and 2% on the remainder of the bill. In the event that the current monthly bill is not paid within 15 days from the date of the bill, the gross rates shall apply.

TERM OF AGREEMENT.

The above rates are based upon a term of agreement of not less than three years.

SECTION 2- It hereby is adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and that an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
