immediate preservation and protection of the public peace, health and safety, and an emergency hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

ORDINANCE No. 379

WHEREAS it is apparent from the motor vehicle traffic on and along the streets of the City of Canby, Oregon, and the parking of motor vehicles on both sides of the streets of the City of Canby, Oregon, life, limb and properties become, and are jeopardous, and that the parking of said motor vehicles must be regulated.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City of Canby, Oregon, by virtue and the authority of the police power vested in it, will from and after the passage of this ordinance regulate the parking of any and all motor vehicles upon the streets of said City within its corporate limits.

SECTION 2. Said City shall construct suitable warning signs
