ORDINANCE NO. 391

AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT THE PRACTICE OF PERSONS GOING IN AND UPON PRIVATE PROPERTY OR CALLING AT RESIDENCES IN THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON, BY SOLICITORS, PEDDLERS, HAWKERS, ITINERANT MERCHANTS, TRANSIENT VENDORS OF MERCHANDISE AND TRANSIENT PHOTOGRAPH SOLICITORS, NOT HAVING BEEN REQUESTED OR INVITED SO TO DO BY THE OWNER OR OWNERS, OCCUPANT OR OCCUPANTS OF SAID PRIVATE RESIDENCE; DECLARING SUCH PRACTICE TO BE A NUISANCE; PROVIDING THE PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF CANBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The practice of persons going in and upon private property or calling at residences in the City of Canby, Oregon, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants, transient vendors of merchandise and transient photograph solicitors, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same or soliciting orders for photographs is hereby prohibited and declared to be a nuisance and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

Section 2: The Police Department and police officers of the City of Canby are hereby required and directed to suppress the same and to abate any such nuisance as is described in the first section of this ordinance.

Section 3: Any person convicted of perpetrating a nuisance as described and prohibited in the first section of this ordinance on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$200.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding 100 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5: In as much as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Canby and its residents in that said residents and inhabitants of this City of Canby are continuously

bothered with agents and peddlers of merchandise; and to eliminate such nuisance it is deemed necessary that an emergency be and the same is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage by the city council and approval by the mayor.

Passed on its first reading by the Canby City Council held on the 3rd day of October, 1955; ordered posted as provided by City Charter and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the council to be held November 7th, 1955, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock p. m., Standard Oregon Time in the Canby City Hall.
